The History of WCRC _____

While working for the Walnut Creek Planning Department in 1968, Bob Graham used to play doubles at lunch time with Darrell Mortensen, Park and Recs Director; John Christenson, Parks Maintenance Director; and Jim Buell, Community Development Director at the downtown courts in Walnut Creek (no longer there). Bob suggested to his partners that the City needed a public tennis program and park facilities to provide more opportunities than were available at private clubs in the County. His colleagues agreed and informed him that Mayor Bob Schroeder and his wife Fran, who knew many women tennis players, were also interested in the same goal.

Bob Graham wanted to form a public tennis club in Walnut Creek in 1968 because his mother taught him and Babe Dedrickson how to play tennis on public courts at Griffiths Park in Los Angeles at the end of World War II. At the time, tennis players were denied access to private clubs based on race, color and creed.

In the Fall of 1968, a dozen or so men and women met at the Schroeder home and at City Hall to pursue this matter. A charter committee was established headed by Jim Buell at the staff level as well as Fran Schroeder and her friends the Bardellinis and the Kings among others. The charter and goals were adopted in the summer of 1969 with original copies on file with the club.

The first tournament was held in the Fall of 1969 at Del Valle High School with about 25 male participants to establish a Men's ladder. The women set up their ladder in early 1970.

Thanks to Bob Schroeder and the Walnut Creek City Council, the 10 courts at Heather Farms were built in 1970 and the first club wide tournament was held.

The 70s were a huge time for tennis. Chris Evert, Jimmy Connors and John McEnroe were at their peak and tennis courts everywhere were packed. Heather Farm was no exception. The courts were always busy and you could drop in and play all day switching around from doubles match to doubles match. Weekends were crazy and courts were busy easily until 4pm both Saturday and Sunday. At that time the pro shop was run by Ren Kern, a close friend to Kern Hildebrand of the City. Ren moved to Lafayette and was replaced by Jim and Dave Trenner. We had two tournaments a year called B & C sponsored by the USTA and at that time the WCRC members volunteered and ran the tournament desk.

In the fall of 1973, the first Walnut Festival Tournament was held with A,B,C and D Categories. The next year the tournament was made an official class tournament and drew players from all over the Bay Area. This tournament continued for over 30 years.

Also in the early 1970's, in memory of her husband Ted Collins, Pat started a Cancer Benefit. This tournament drew some of the best players in the county at the time including: The Saputo brothers Len and Mike, Dick Vandevort, Brent Abel, Jill and John Toni, and Les Hanson, the club pro among others. Les Hanson would play doubles with up and coming junior players in the Cancer Tournament; some of those juniors who played included Doug Swallow, Chris Curley, Eric Berg, Steve Towne, Greg Davis, Doug King and Ric Bardellini.

As a function of the Walnut Creek Racquet Club, Ladies Day tennis originally met on Thursday mornings from 9 am to 12 noon at Del Valle High School. When the Heather Farm Courts were completed, the ladies met there. At that time, there was no pro shop, water fountain, rest rooms, wind screens, lights or even grass. People would use the facilities at the Shell Station. The criteria for Ladies Day: bring one ball, new or use and you must be a Walnut Creek City resident or a member of the Racquet Club. That has held true over the years, although many a lady has falsified her address just so she could play.

Dorothy Butler has been an icon for Ladies Day at Heather Farm for 35 years. In fact, she also signed the original petition for the courts to be built. Dorothy inherited Ladies Day by default. Bobbie Eliason, the coordinator, had asked Dorothy to cover for her one Friday, and Bobbie never returned! In addition to running Ladies Day, Dorothy served on the Racquet Club board as secretary.

The WCRC was also very involved in junior teams, at that time called Contra Costa League. They basically gave money for team shirts each year and several parents including Verna Ogden volunteered their time driving kids to and from matches.

After some controversy it was agreed to allow Juniors to participate in the Club Championships.

Since 1998 the WCRC has had 89 USTA teams go on to League championships. We participate in an average of over 55 USTA teams a year in everything from 2.5 adult League to Super Senior-65 Leagues. We also offer three very popular WCRC Leagues: Summer Singles, Winter Doubles and this year we introduced Fall Mixed Doubles. All of our Leagues are competitive with players coming from all over the Bay Area to sign up.

We are very proud of the Walnut Creek Racquet Club, now over 800 members strong. It is still a place where players can come and pick up a game on weekday afternoons or weekend mornings. Where anyone playing on court 4 has to be able to take a little good-natured kidding; where arrogance has no place; and where newcomers are welcome. Our USTA Leagues, formerly Volvo Leagues are very strong at Heather Farm and bring in players from all over the area. ■

A USTA Community Tennis Association (CTA) is "any incorporated, geographically defined, not-for-profit, volunteer-based tennis organization that supports or provides programs which promote and develop the growth of tennis."

In essence, a CTA is a tennis-specific service organization. It is an organized group of dedicated volunteers and professionals who come together to support community tennis programs. As an association, the group works to coordinate and maintain programs and services and guarantees they are open and accessible to all. These tennis enthusiasts may act as advocates, program administrators, promoters, or fund-raisers. Fueled by local volunteers, this not-for-profit association exists to promote and develop the game of tennis in the community.

Really exciting news for us and for all of our volunteers who work so hard to make this such a great club.
