Making A Point Of Service: David Pintado

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to start a new monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this new commentary.

Serving is a very important part of WCRC member David Pintado's life, but his most important service happens off the tennis court as he teaches, coaches, and mentors the next generation of leaders in our community.

A native of Mexico, David was born and raised in Baja California and eventually moved to northern California because his wife Katie Leonard hails from Walnut Creek, and he came to Heather Farm around 2012 or 2013 when one of his colleagues from Heald College recommended the club to him. If you've gotten to know David at all, you probably know that you'd be hard pressed to find another club member with as interesting and eclectic a background.




David started playing tennis at age 8 in Mexico but his father wanted him to learn how to protect himself so he enrolled David in a martial arts academy at age 10. He soon became a black belt in both taekwondo and the Korean discipline of tang soo do, and at age 15 he began teaching both martial arts to other kids. David found that he really enjoyed teaching, and still excelled in martial arts himself and for a brief period he was personally taught by the martial arts legend Chuck Norris, (aka Walker, Texas Ranger.)

David is a medical doctor by training and practiced medicine in Mexico for 25 years before moving away

from an active medical practice to pursue a career in academia. David has taught health education curriculum at Mount Diablo High School (MDHS, where he also leads the medical academy), Heald College, and Diablo Valley College, training the next generation of health professionals in courses such as medical terminology, emergency medicine, and healthcare careers. At Mount Diablo High School David also coached tennis and WCRC is one of the main sponsors of the MDHS team, through David's connection with both entities.

David is most proud to have led the implementation of USTA's inclusive "no cut" program at MDHS to include persons of all



abilities and backgrounds in the game of tennis. For his work, USTA named him a top ten coach in the United States in 2018, a rare and very well deserved honor.

When he's not playing tennis, teaching, or doing his frequent charitable work in the community through the Free Masons, the Orinda Masonic Lodge, or the Concord Democratic Club (where he served two years as President) David enjoys spending time with his family and exploring the many local treasures we're fortunate to have right here in the Bay Area. His son Kevin (age 32) is a professional drummer who has toured all over the world with the Eagles as Don Henley's "right hand man," as well as performing at the White House for then President Obama. And yes, the Eagles are still touring, if you are wondering like I was. You can check out any time you'd like but you can never leave, indeed.

David draws upon a lot of the lessons he learned through martial arts to guide him through life, as well as to play better tennis. All of these activities require discipline, continuing education, and honor to do well. David has taken that to heart and truly gives back to the club and the community through his charitable spirit, and we should be proud to call him our tennis partner and friend. His advice to someone taking up the game of tennis? Have fun, learn, improve, and don't get angry. Sage words we should all take to heart. ♦

Five different WCRC Members went to Nationals last month and husband and wife Chris Lau, Lena Larionova Agung Zakaria, Marianne Dundon and Steve Lehmer.

First weekend, Lena playing 4.0 singles:

Mary Sikes (TX): good starting match, game like Tammie but for singles. Super low toss and serve, balls were either low and fast or dropping right over the net, making me run for everything. Luckily, this is a game I know how to play, so I took this match 4-0 4-2.

Amanda Hart (GA): Georgia's rep and a recent 4.5 bump, Amanda was very steady and athletic. She was very good at neutralizing my pace and making me run for another ball in the opposite corner. Suffice to say, this match was long. We went all the way to third set tiebreak, and had to spin to serve at 4-4. Unfortunately for me, fast four tiebreaks leave no room for error. Amanda won the spin and took serve, and the point right after, so I just barely lost this one by a point.

Hannah (IL): the next day, went up against Hannah, and quickly realized that we have pretty much the same game. This match was a good time from start to finish - another three-setter, but this time the third set went my way.

Alexis (CO): Sunday morning, the playoffs started for each draw. Alexis was a super clean player with a classic game. Unfortunately, I could feel myself being tired early in the match, and my legs finally

couldn't handle the pressure and the Arizona heat. We had some nice points, but Alexis took the match, and that ended the tournament for me.

Lena Ended up in 7th place (playoff #2 draw).

First weekend, Marianne Dundon playing 5.0 singles

At the same time, Marianne Dundon was representing Walnut Creek in 5.0 singles. While I didn't get to see all



of her matches (some were at the same time as mine), she played a weekend of amazing tennis and finished in first place!

Highlight: Marianne's last match was against a young college player with a classic, topspin game. Marianne played the same girl earlier that weekend in a round robin and lost - but she figured her out. In the tournament draw, they met again in the final, and it was clear that Marianne knew what to do. Everything came back as a perfectly placed chip or a lob, breaking the college girl's rhythm and dominating the midcourt like I've never seen anyone else do.

Final: This is where it finally got tough, against a super steady pair from Oklahoma. Older guy, leftie, really good hands at net, everything comes back. Younger guy, really aggressive and had big forehands. He made a lot of errors earlier in the tournament, but dialed it in for this match. Chris and Agung played their best match of the tournament here but just pulled up short - they lost this one in two sets, both in tiebreaks. The second set went to a sudden death racquet spin, which the opponents won. With the leftie serving for the match, the opponents immediately had the advantage, and won the point.

This put them in 2nd place for the tournament.

Overall, it was an amazing weekend with great people - everyone was friendly, happy to be there and be playing great tennis, no drama to be seen.

Next weekend, Chris and Agung played 3.5 doubles:

1: Match started out immediately with a net cord dropper from the returner, but Agung was right on top of it. That pretty much set the tone for the match - Chris and Agung both played clean, served and volleyed well, and the opponents just kept netting everything. As expected, they had lots trouble with Agung's slice and Chris's spin, and our guys easily won this match.



NTRP 3.5 Men's Champion Steve Lehmer!

Last month, I had the opportunity to compete at the USTA 40+ 3.5 NTRP singles championships in San Diego. This was an event that brought players from across all of the USTA sections. Each of the sections apparently has their own process for determining their representatives. For Norcal, there was a qualifier tournament in late 2021, and you had to finish 1st or 2nd in that in order to get to Nationals.



The structure was similar to how Norcal runs team Sectionals. My grouping had 30 competitors overall. We were all put into smaller groups for a round-robin portion of 3-4 matches. Based on your finish in the round-robin, you were then placed into a single elimination bracket (top RR finisher into "Gold," 2nd place into "Silver," etc.). From there, quarters, semis, and finals for those who made it that far.

All matches were Fast-4 format...basically no-ad scoring with 2 of 3 sets to 4 games, and a 5-point set tiebreaker that kicks in at 3 games all. Every point seems super important in that format. I was fortunate enough to reach the final. It ended up being a really good battle that ultimately went to a tiebreaker in the 3rd set, and that tiebreaker came down to a single point, which would be winner take all. I was able to force an error on my opponent,

and take it. Winning the championship was just the icing on the cake...a pretty cool feeling!
