Two Davis Aggies Leading a Sporting Life: Sabrina McQueen & Thomas Lyhne

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

Since every celebrity power couple needs a catchy portmanteau nickname for their fans think "Brangelina", you might just refer to the husband/wife duo of WCRC members Thomas Lyhne and Sabrina "Bean" McQueen collectively as the "McLyhnes", like some of their friends and the paparazzi do.



Thomas and Sabrina both played a sport at the collegiate level at UC Davis and bring a wealth of athletic experience and skills to the tennis community at Heather Farm. Thomas has much more experience with tennis, having started playing as an elementary school-aged child shortly after his family emigrated to the United States from Denmark so his father could pursue his Phd at Cal. They landed in Lafayette, and Thomas' father organized group lessons for Thomas and other local nine and ten year olds. Ironically, several members from those initial youth group lessons ended up playing tennis at the collegiate level, including Thomas at UC Davis. An all-around athlete at Campolindo High School, Thomas also played basketball and soccer in addition to tennis. Following high school graduation, when Thomas already knew he'd be playing tennis at UC Davis, he spent a year in Southern France honing his game at a private academy on the Mediterranean Sea and competing in the men's open "second series" throughout continental Europe before heading back home to attend school in Davis. With that resume, it's not surprising that Thomas is a fluid and accomplished player, and the only person this reporter has personally seen catch a screaming long ball directly out of the air on his racquet head during a baseline rally, demonstrating his uncanny comfort wielding a racquet like an extension of his hand.

Sabrina is also a local girl who grew up in Pleasant Hill and also has an extensive athletic resume, primarily in soccer, which she played through high school and at UC Davis also, which is where she and Thomas met through a fraternity formal. Due to their mutual background in the sport, Sabrina and Thomas played coed soccer together but Bean never really played any tennis until about ten years ago, which coincided with Thomas picking up his racquet again after about a fifteen year hiatus from tennis

following college while he was embarking on his career and he and the McLyhnes were starting a family.

It's understandable that Thomas didn't pick up a tennis racquet for so long as he and Sabrina were transitioning into the next phase of their life together after college. The couple moved to San Francisco, where Sabrina started pharmacology school at UCSF. She is still a practicing pharmacist with Costco in Concord. Meanwhile, Thomas began to pursue his career in sports marketing, an industry he worked in for several decades before setting out on his own and founding his own sports marketing agency in 2015, TL Group Marketing, which he still runs today. At the same time, Thomas and Sabrina decided to start a family, and their daughters Gitte and Mela were both born in San Francisco during their early days in the City.

Since both Bean and Thomas grew up in the East Bay, they eventually migrated back out here to god's country from the City, and have become fixtures both at Heather Farm and in the broader Walnut Creek community. Older daughter Gitte attended Walnut Creek schools through Las Lomas High School and is currently studying at Oregon State university, while Mela is a sophomore at Las Lomas. Both girls are accomplished athletes like their parents; Gitte is a competitive ballroom dancer, and Mela plays soccer at Las Lomas. Bean is heavily involved in the school community and serves as parent advisor to the sophomore class at Las Lomas, and has also coached soccer locally.

Besides work and raising a family, Bean's and Thomas' hobbies mainly center around sports and outdoor recreational activities. They are still tight with their core group of friends from UC Davis and see them frequently, and you can often find Bean and Thomas outdoors camping or in Tahoe skiing, two of their favorite pastimes. And of course they play plenty of tennis. Sabrina is new to this sport but is a lifelong competitive athlete, and she calls it "genius" how the USTA leagues are structured so that players compete against others who are at their same level. Thomas is currently rated at 4.5 and plays on several USTA teams each season.

When we discussed what Sabrina and Thomas enjoy most about playing tennis through WCRC at Heather Farm, their responses echoed almost all of the same sentiments that have been mentioned by every club member who has been interviewed for the "member spotlight" series, and underscores

how fortunate we all are to be involved with this special community. Like so many club members, Thomas and Bean both think that WCRC and Heather Farm is not just about tennis, it's more about the community we've developed that transcends the game. Everyone from the management to the office staff and the other players are so genuine and welcoming, Bean loves how she can go to Heather Farm at any time and hit, and also see people she knows and likes and who support one another through all of life's twists and turns, both on and off the court. Thomas and Sabrina both expressed their gratitude for the people who do all the administrative and behind the scenes work like organizing events and especially captaining USTA teams. Usually it's the same small core group of members who volunteer to be captains and their effort has a powerful ripple effect when a small group of leaders at WCRC are able to facilitate the enjoyment of the game through

league play for literally hundreds of other players. And to continue with the running themes of this member spotlight series, it was Heather Farm's unofficial mayor, Tammie Snyder, who initially brought Thomas into the Heather Farm tennis community by inviting him out to one of her epic Monday practices. And once Bean started playing tennis more seriously, her first league experience was on one of Cara Mia Barnacascel's "Deuces Wild" teams. (Bean was brand new to the game but USTA required her to compete as a 3.0 right



from the start because she had played college soccer.) Countless club members can say the exact same thing about being introduced to the club through Tammie's Monday practice or on a Deuces Wild team. Again, another example of a small group of leaders spreading the joy of the game of tennis exponentially.

Although they humbly maintain a low profile, if you're ever in the checkout aisle at your local supermarket and see the McLyhnes on a tabloid cover next to photos of "Swelce" (Taylor Swift and Travis Kelce), don't be surprised, because this couple of Davis Aggies is living a sporting life and doing it right. ▲

Some shout-outs:

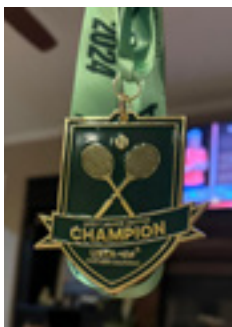

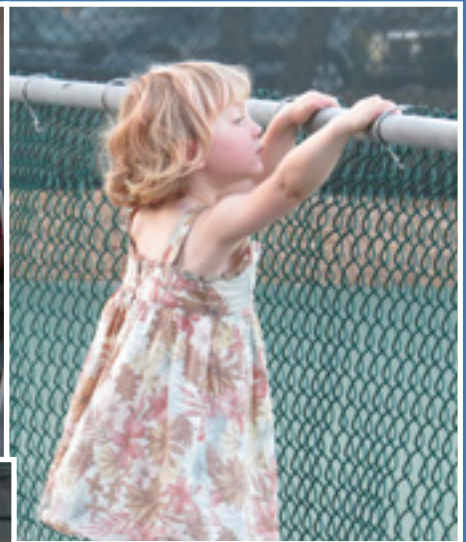

NTRP LEVELS Mixed 6.0–9.0*

SCHEDULING This is an open schedule. Players are responsible for scheduling their own matches. Players will be provided with a contact list of participants within their division.

MATCH FORMAT Best two-out-of-three set format.
A super tiebreaker can be played if all players agree, otherwise full third.
Both teams responsible for bringing balls to match; winning team gets the unopened can.
Matches should be played according to the "Rules of Tennis."

TOURNAMENT End of season tournament with draw determined by league standings to be held over the weekend of Mar 7–9, 2025 dependent upon court scheduling and weather. To qualify for the tournament, teams must have completed and reported at least 2 matches during the regular league season. Depending on the number of entrants tournament play may include Friday night play. In addition, draws with large numbers of players may be required to play matches prior to the tournament weekend. Seeding for the tournament will be based on regular season standings of the top 4 teams in each division. The more matches you and your partner play, the higher your ranking will be. A minimum of 4 teams are required to generate a draw.



* Teams with ratings more than 1 full step apart (i.e. 3.0 & 5.0 to make up an 8.0 team) are not eligible to play the end of season tournament.
