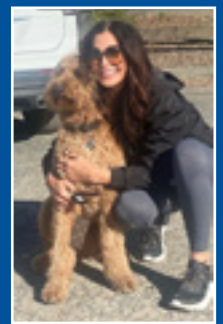

10 Years of Love and Sports:

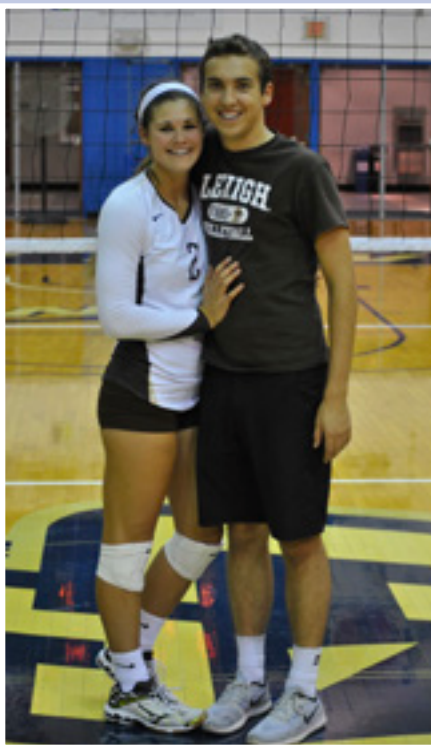
Stephanie Stieber and Chris Alexander

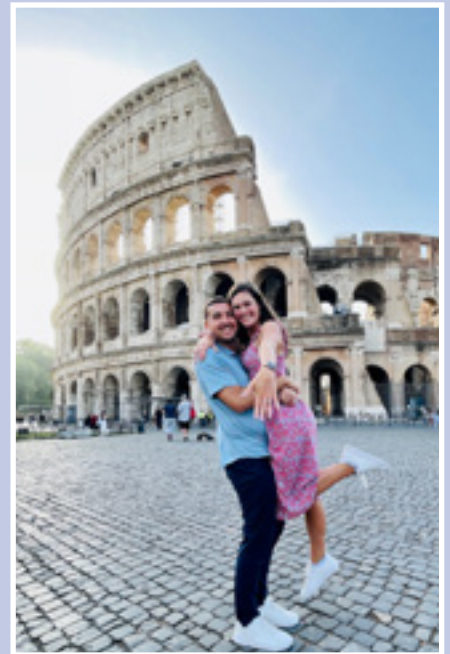
W CRC members Chris Alexander and Stephanie Stieber have become staples at Heather Farms since their move to Walnut Creek in 2021.

Nationals

Marina & Brian Wills had a great year in 2023 as 4.0s, and after winning the NTRP Gold Cup at the end of the 2023 season they both qualified for Nationals in multiple events. However, there was a hitch; both were bumped to 4.5 in 2024, and since Nationals was held in April 2024 . . . the Wills were forced to play at the higher level. One of them did well, the other not so much.

In early April, Marina was first to take the singles court and immediately ran into the reigning

4.5 National Champion.



Marina did not find her game quick enough and put the "Fast" in "Fast Four Format". However, Marina's subsequent matches were competitive and her confidence grew with each game and set. Marina locked in her forehand and her slice game . . . winning her final three matches of the weekend to finish in the Top 10.

In mid April, Brian & Matt Lourens were supposed to compete in Men's 4.5 Doubles . . . but Matt lost confidence in his partner (who wouldn't) and decided to injure himself a week before Nationals. Brian scrambled to replace Matt and paired (some might say, "upgraded") with Jeff Chale

from Gold River. Jeff did most of the heavy lifting and carried Brian. The duo were able to force some three-setter matches but the only win they retrieved was the final match of the weekend in order to avoid last place. Although Brian did not do as well as Marina, he tells himself he finished on a firm 1-0 win streak.

In late April, Marina & Brian headed to Arizona for Mixed 9.0 Nationals. Their tennis aspirations included: preserve the marriage, hide inevitable eye rolling, avoid calling USTA officials to complain about a partner getting passed down the line, elude the overwhelming sensation to hit the other with a tennis ball
