
Young to Assume WCRC Reins

He is employed as Operations Manager for the Walnut Creek Printing Company, publisher of *The Court Reporter*.

Young didnÕplay much tennis growing up and only became interested in the sport after his mother dragged him out to the courts as a form of rehabilitation for a shoulder injury in the early 1970s. A tenyear veteran of USTA League play with a current 3.5 rating, he has been a member of squads from Pleasant Hill and Orindawoods and is currently captain of one of the WCRC⑤ Mixed 6.0 Doubles teams.


