Jones and Zavala grab MenÕs 4.5 title

At least one unseeded team saved their best tennis for last during the season-ending Winter Doubles League tournament, held April 5-7. In the tournament biggest surprise, Frank Jones and Rich Zavala, who ended the regular season with a dismal 1-3 record in Men 4.5, played inspired tennis throughout the weekend and defeated 44 seeded Rich Miller and Marty Tedlock in the final 6-2, 6-3. The win was doubly gratifying for Jones and Zavala as they avenged a straight set loss to Miller and Tedlock from earlier in the season.

Steve King and Kurt Nesheim, seeded #15, failed to drop a set in five matches to win the Men® 3.5 division. Along the way, they upset #1 Jon van Oosbree and Ray Thomas before beating Mike Wilhelm/John Greenblatt in the final, 7-6, 7-5.

Conversely, four other titles were won by teams with the best regular season record in their respective divisions. In Women 3.0, top seeded Cheryl Fredericks and Helaine Yagor steamrolled #6 Nancy LeSage and Michelle Gold in the final 6-1, 6-0, capping an undefeated season. The same was true in Women 3.5 where Patti May and Kathleen Chaffee posted eight wins in the regular season, then added four more wins to capture the championship. May/Chaffee bested Sheila Klenow and Shirley Watkins, 7-5, 6-1 in

WCRC SUMMER TEAM TENNIS

This is the WCRC's first Summer Team Tennis program. Registration is limited to the first 36 men and 36 women to sign up. There will be six teams of 12 players (6 male, 6 female) with each team playing six times during a nine (9) week season. Team Tennis will be held every Friday night from 6:30 pm - 9:30 pm with four rounds of play -- each player will play at least two rounds. Only four (4) teams will play each week with the other two teams having a bye. Each player will be assigned randomly to a team with a pre-selected captain. Dinner will be served. Team Tennis includes a cook-off -- not only will you compete on the court, but off it as well! The season runs from June 14 - August 9, 2002.
