WCRC Summer Singles League Marks 20th Year Anniversary

One of the most popular programs in the WCRC's long history, the Summer Singles League started in 1998 as the brainchild of Kent Lindeman and Mike Jetland. The two were looking for alternatives to USTA leagues at a time when NorCal was making changes that were generally unpopular with players

 biggest among them the introduction of a superbreaker in lieu of a third set.

In its inaugural year, there were just 48 players and 2 Men's Divisions (4.0-4.5 and 5.0-5.5). Players received a weekly email bulletin with match results and updates, which helped to facilitate matches being scheduled and completed.

In 2000, the league expanded to 6 total divisions (Men's 3.5 thru 5.0-5.5 and Women's 3.0 thru 4.5-5.0) with the help of League Coordinators Mike Jetland and Jennifer Scriabine and was marketed to players all throughout Contra Costa County.

The very next year saw the introduction of the online league reporting system, programmed by Sean Zhang, which allowed players to enter their scores online instead of reporting them to league coordinators. By 2002, there were 8 divisions (Women's 2.5 and Men's 3.0 added) and 450 players in the league, each required to play a minimum of 6 matches to qualify for the end of season tournament.

At its zenith, there were over 250 tournament players, which necessitated a 6 days over 2 weekends event to crown 8 division winners at the Walnut Creek Tennis Center. Among the champions were USTA National Gold Ball winners and Division I and II standouts but also regular tennis enthusiasts who excelled at their specific level – that was one of true attractions of the league.

The Summer Singles League also spawned the Doubles and Mixed Doubles Leagues and was one of the reasons why the WCRC was named USTA Nor Cal Community Tennis Association of the Year in 2002.

Players from all ages and ratings came to honor Tom's life. De Anza High School from Richmond, El Cerrito High School, Spartans Tennis Team were among those that played and had tons of fun. They also went home with free tennis gear and other items donated from local supporters like Lifetime Tennis and East Bay CPR.

There is no doubt that Tom left a seed at Mount Diablo HS and the players to come will be honoring his life and legacy by doing what Mr Breza loved to do the most: Play Tennis!!
