MATCH FORMAT

Best two-out-of-three set format, must play full third set not 10-point

tiebreaker. No SUPERTIEBREAKERS! Both teams responsible for bringing balls to match; winning team gets unopened can. Matches should be played according to the "Rules of Tennis."

TOURNAMENT End of season tournament with draw determined by league standings

to be held over the weekend of Feb 7-9, 2020 dependent upon court scheduling and weather. To qualify for the tournament, teams must have completed and reported at least 6 matches during the regular league season. Depending on the number of entrants tournament play may include Friday night play. In addition, draws with large numbers of players may be required to play matches prior to the tournament weekend. Seeding for the tournament will be based on regular season standings of the top 4 teams in each division.

The more matches you and your partner play, the higher your ranking will be.

A minimum of 4 teams are required to generate a draw.

*Teams with ratings more than 1 full step apart (i.e. 3.0 & 5.0 to make up an 8.0 team) are **NOT** eligible to play the end of season tournament.



Spotlight

Walt Thomas Forever Young

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to start a new monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this new commentary.



he old cliché "age is just a number" certainly applies to long-time WCRC member, Walt Thomas. Walt played table tennis tournaments before he started thinking about picking up a tennis racquet, but let's back up a bit and start at the beginning of this incredible man's story.

Born in Berkeley, Walt has lived within a 20 mile radius of the Bay Area for all of his life. He's a proud Berkeley High graduate and just a few months ago went to his 70th high school reunion. With just 35-40 people attending from two different graduating classes, Walt reunited with three friends from kindergarten and one friend from earlier days than that. During high school Walt was a bit of rebel, hanging out with the guys, hot-rodding around, using the gas they would siphon out of other cars. Just a typical teenage boy at the time.

The Korean War started and you can probably guess that Uncle Sam decided Walt needed to serve his country. So in 1952, Walt became a Marine. He spent two years as a Marine and while it wasn't his favorite time of life, he credits the Marines with two things: (1) he got his one and only tattoo while

in Oceanside at Camp Pendleton, and (2) he says the Marines saved his life by taking him away from his Berkeley group of friends.

Out of the Marines, Walt came back to the Bay Area, went back to college and became an electronic tech. Ultimately, he landed a job at the Alameda Naval Air Station where he stayed for 36 years. Yes, one job for his entire career! He loved his job, his co-workers and being a civil servant. Walt admits his job wasn't overly demanding and during lunch hour he first began playing table tennis. After beating up on his co-workers, playing table tennis, he decided to branch out and joined a table tennis club in Berkeley where he was no longer top dog. It took him a while but a few members took him "under their wing" and eventually he began entering and winning tournaments.

Not satisfied with just one sport, a co-worker gave Walt tennis lessons because there were six courts on the Base where they worked. The friend gave him a metal racquet and he found the transition smooth and easy. Within just a few months he was playing "D" level tournaments and loving his



new sport. While on a family vacation in Santa Barbara he met a tennis player from Orinda who suggested he join the Orinda Tennis Club.

What's interesting is that Walt's Father was a tennis player who always wanted his son to play and they lived across the street from San Pablo Tennis Courts in Berkeley. During that time, though, Walt's high school friends convinced him not to play. Now all these years later, he found himself looking for a tennis club in Orinda. These were booming years for tennis and there was a five year waiting list in the Orinda Tennis Club and in Walnut Creek there was a three year waiting list for non-Walnut Creek residents! Because of the scarcity of courts, Walt joined the Concord Tennis Club because there wasn't a wait. After three years, he made it into Walnut Creek tennis and never looked back.

One of Walt's favorite memories is of a 7.0 mixed team he was on with Terri Hernandez as Captain. They made it to playoffs and had a ball. Walt retired his tennis racquet just a year ago but

he's still a man on the move, riding his bike 3 to 5 times a week.

To ensure he has lots of riding options, Walt belongs to five different bicycle clubs. That way he gets to cherry pick the rides he wants. Walt was bemoaning the fact that he's only ridden about 1600 miles this year due to last winter's weather. Usually he rides 3 to 4,000 miles. His preferred bike club is in Fremont where he rides every Thursday with 10 to 15 others. Every year on Walt's birthday, the Fremont club hosts his birthday ride and upwards of 50 people join. If you know Walt, you'd understand why people do whatever they can to be a part of the celebration.

Just so you don't think this is a sports-only man, Walt's a big music fan and still enjoys going

to concerts. A local and nationally known musician, Carlos Reyes, is not only his favorite but something of a friend.

So, that's a glimpse of our friend Walt Thomas' life. If you think of it, send him happy birthday wishes as he celebrates at his favorite restaurant, Texas Roadhouse, on September 13. And one other thing. As we parted ways, Walt was getting ready for Steve Buchholz's Table Tennis Tournament. Of course, age has no boundaries for a man like Walt.
