Friday Night Team Tennis Coordinator(s) Needed

One or two players are needed to run the program which runs 9 Friday nites. TEAM REGISTRATION NOW AVAILABLE FOR CCTA LEAGUE PLAY



The Contra Costa Tennis Association (CCTA), backed by its title sponsor Richlen Construction, has announced that its first season of organized team play is set for June 21 through October 19. Starting April 15, teams and individual players from both private and public facilities can be registered by visiting www.ccta.cc. Team registration deadline is June 1, however individual players can be added to rosters throughout the season.

In an effort to offer a competitive, yet fun environment, the leagues will start with a "Kick-Off Weekend" on June 21-22 at the Walnut Creek Tennis Center. During the weekend, a number of team matches will be contested with food and T-shirts provided to emphasize interaction by players.

In addition, instead of a limited entry playoff format, the CCTA will hold a two-weekend end of the season tournament (October 11-12 & 18-19) where each team would qualify and be seeded as determined by their standing in regular season play. The inclusion of all teams into playoffs is important so that captains do not feel pressured to put out their best team each match and give a larger number of people the opportunity to play during the season.

Match format will be two (2) singles and three (3) doubles for Men's and Women's 3.0 - 4.5 and one (1) singles and two (2) doubles for Women's 2.5 & 5.0 as well as Men's 5.0. The CCTA website will enable captains to enter match scores, calculate standings and give players the ability to "scout" upcoming opponents.

League players must be CCTA members. CCTA membership (\$25/year) includes individual league registration fees as well as monthly electronic publications and discounts to play in other association leagues and tournaments throughout the year. Players can go online and simultaneously register to become a CCTA member and sign up for a team.


Young and Hoyer Make it Two in a Row


