THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

WCRC vs WCTC

Do you know the difference between the Walnut Creek Racquet Club and the Walnut Creek Tennis Center? Most people confuse the two, and in some cases, are not even aware that they are two separate entities. In general, the Walnut Creek Tennis Center manages all of the city of Walnut

Creek's public tennis courts and the Walnut Creek Racquet Club runs leagues and tournaments utilizing those same courts.

This newsletter is one benefit of being a member of the Walnut Creek Racquet Club. In addition, you are eligible to compete in many tournaments: Valentine's Day, Calcutta, Mixed Doubles Club Championship, the Men and Women's Club Championships, and the Turkey Tournament. We also sponsor all of the USTA tennis teams that play on the Walnut Creek public courts. Currently, the most successful programs we offer are the Winter Doubles League and the Summer Singles League, each with over 400 participants. Membership is a bargain at \$25 for Walnut Creek residents and \$30 for non-residents. Renewals are \$15/20 per year respectively and that's for an entire family. As **Judy Stillman**, former membership chairperson, used to say, "How often do you write a check for \$25?"

One thing that is not included in the Walnut Creek Racquet Club membership is court fees for the Heather Farm tennis courts. That's because the courts are managed by the Walnut Creek Tennis Center. The Tennis Center staff, led by **Jim Farber**, has been contracted by the city to manage all of Walnut Creek's public tennis courts. The city sets the rates for light fees, daily court use fees and the yearly court usage cards. Only a very small percentage of the court usage cards revenue goes to the Tennis Center, all of the other revenue goes directly to the city. Be sure and buy a yearly card and keep yours current.

The Walnut Creek Tennis Center runs four USTA sponsored tournaments every year: the Spring Fling, the Walnut Festival, the Cracker tournament and the Qualifier. They also offer lessons, both private and group, for all ages in addition to youth summer camps. Every Friday, you'll see one of the staff (usually **Dave Sperry**) making the rounds to the outlying courts (Rudgear, Larkey, Northgate & Arbolado) to blow them, check the nets, empty the trash and to do any other necessary maintenance. The Tennis Center is also a bargain, at just \$150 per year for a court use card, which is what many people pay monthly at a private club.

WCRC Teams "Kickoff" Inaugural CCTA Season

Six WCRC teams participated in the Contra Costa Tennis Association's (CCTA) "Kickoff Weekend", held July 19-20 at ClubSport Valley Vista. Despite temperatures in the mid-90s (and an on court reading of 120 degrees!), players enjoyed friendly team competition, a BBQ, T-shirts and a tennis trivia contest.

Women's 3.5 play dominated the event as 11 teams from around the county are entered in this division. **Carolyn Spady's "Loyal Ones**" squad opened the weekend with a 4-1 loss to a tough Crow Canyon CC team, which was followed by a 4-1 win by **Karen Hirtzel's "Retrievers"** against Oakhurst CC. **Tammie Snyder** picked up a key 3-6, 6-0, 6-3 win at #2 singles to help clinch the win. **Susie Dunlap's "Creekers"** gained a 4-1 decision over ClubSport San Ramon while **Carmen Duarte's "Tiebreakers"** dropped a tough 3-2 decision to ClubSport Valley Vista, which won both of their opening weekend matches.

On the Men's side, **Robert Goldstein's 3.5** "Strings" team lost 4-1 to ClubSport Valley Vista, with the single WCRC point secured by **Pete Fong** and

Despite straight set wins by **Mike Joe** at #1 Singles and **Robert Young** and **Tosh Kuritsubo** at #2 Doubles, **Gerry Brown's** 3.5 team lost 3-2 to Pleasant Hill TC. A Men's 3.0 team, captained by **Stuart Levitas**, will also represent the WCRC in the CCTA, however they did not see action during the "Kickoff."

The league's regular season will last through the end of September, with a team tournament scheduled for October 11-12 & 18-19 at St. Mary's College. WCRC Teams Head to USTA District Playoffs

Two WCRC teams will be headed to USTA District Playoffs on August 8-10 at Round Hill Country Club after completing successful regular seasons and navigating the treacherous waters of Local Playoffs.

Jane Ladrech's Women's 3.5 team rolled through the regular season with an unblemished 10-0 record and continued their dominance with a 4-1 win over Orindawoods in the opening round of Local Playoffs, led by singles wins by Suzanne Beck and Valerie Fung-a-Ling. The doubles tandems of Ladrech/Gill Foong and Shari Huber/Darcy Lopes spearheaded a 4-1 win over Moraga Country Club in Round #2, leading to a showdown with Terri Hernandez's Women's 3.5 team for a ticket to Districts. Hernandez's squad had finished with a 10-1 regular season record and secured the top seed in their flight. Ladrech's team prevailed in a hard-fought 3-2 match, played at St. Mary's on July 25.

Nick Scriabine's Men's 4.0 team, which consists

of many of the same players who advanced to Sectionals in 2001, compiled a solid 8-0 regular season record and easily breezed through Local Playoffs with 4-1 wins against Round Hill and then Valley Vista. This time around, they look to avoid the controversial roller coaster ride of two years ago when the team finished second in round robin play but advanced to Carmel when the winning team's singles player was DQ'ed for playing out of class.


Other teams still fighting for a spot in districts at press time were **Stephanie Law's Women's 3.0** team, which had won two rounds of playoffs and facing Oakhurst Country Club for the right to advance and **Tammy Chan's Men's 5.0** team, which had leap-frogged **Martin Dunlap's Men's 5.0** squad with a strong end of season winning streak to make playoffs with a 9-3 record.

Additional WCRC playoff results...Laurie Brunkow's Women's 4.0 team (7-4) upset Judy Griffith's previously unbeaten Women's 4.0 team (11-0) in the opening round of Local Playoffs, with key wins by Garbo Berger at #2 singles and Marybeth Kolding/Janet Gee & Randy Chen-Tse/Wendy Chow in doubles. In the process, they avenged an earlier season 5-0 loss to Griffith's team but could not keep the momentum going the following week, as they traveled to Round Hill and lost, 4-1... Ritz Utz's Women's 3.5 team made the playoffs with a solid 7-3 record, but were overmatched against Hernandez's 3.5 team, dropping a 4-1 decision in the first round...Don Loeffler's Men's 3.5 team, which was the sole WCRC representative at Sectionals in 2002, was beaten 3-2 in the second round by Pinole Park, a team that had also defeated them in the regular season.

WCRC Team Young & Hoyer Win Another One...

Robert Young and **Jay Hoyer** did it again in winning the Sonoma Taco Summer NTRP tournament in Men's 3.5 Doubles. While winning the final 6-0, 6-1 wasn't that interesting, Robert having to play with a borrowed racquet was.

Seems he backed his Mustang over his tennis bag, crushing all three of his racquets just before the match. Jay, being the supportive partner. remained calm and commented, "It might be a good time to demo some newer racquets".
