
recorded by the Secretary and always include a report from the Treasurer. USTA, tournaments, Leagues, membership, Web site, newsletter and any new business is always discussed.

Bown Double Winner in Club Championships

Benicia's Chris Bown captured both the Men's A Singles and Doubles crowns at the 2003 WCRC Club Championships, held August 16-17 & 23-24 at the Walnut Creek Tennis Center. In winning his first WCRC singles title, Bown beat #2-seeded Mike Rizarri 3-6, 7-6 (6), 6-4 in the semis and San Ramon's Tony Lum 6-4, 7-5 in the final. He then

teamed with newcomer **Ron Hidayat** to take the doubles crown with a 6-1, 6-4 win over Rizarri and **Thor Schreck**. It was Bown's third consecutive Men's A Doubles title, having won it the previous two years with **Mark Litzau** as his partner.

Third-seeded **Charles Kearney** staged an improbable yet gutty comeback against **Dave Berlier** to win the Men's B Singles championship. Down 2-5 in the final set, Kearney dug deep and did not concede another game, posting a 5-7, 7-5, 7-5 victory. The tandem of **Mike Druding** and **Craig Simmons** won the Men's B Doubles with a 6-4, 6-3 decision over **Dennis Goins** and **Francis Crusit**.

Top seeded **Ron Helgesson** added a 2003 Men's C Singles title to his already overloaded trophy case, straight-setting four opponents, including defending champion **Philip Hensley** in the final, 6-4, 6-3. **Debashis Panda** and **Tony Kim** upset **Nat Bitton** and **Peter Hellmann** 6-1, 7-5 to win the Men's C Doubles.

Chris Ramsower-Pearlstein easily retained her claim as the Women's A Singles and Doubles champion for a fourth straight year. She dispatched #2 seeded Yumi Suzuki in the singles final 6-4, 6-1, then teamed with Kim Lackey to down Margo Garner and Marianne Dundon 6-0, 6-1. Top-seeded Shari Huber defeated Catherine Wang 6-3, 6-4 to win the Women's B Singles and Sybil Schmidt went 2-0 in round robin play to capture the Women's C

The Men's 4.0 team, captained by **Nick Scriabine** and **Mike Willis**, marched into the weekend undefeated. On Day 1 they pulled out a 4-1 win, which was not as easy as it sounds.

crowd. It started out very close but Dave got the momentum and went on to take the match. Their third day was by far the easiest, they won four matches in straight sets and their only loss was in a super tie-break.

Jane Ladrech and Valerie Fung-A-Ling's Women's 3.5 team also entered Districts undefeated. When their number one singles player out with a back injury, Walnut Creek lost both singles matches. The doubles saved the day, with Ann Little and Corby Mullins winning easily in a third set super tiebreak to

clinch the match. The second day was a breeze by comparison. They won all five, four of them in straight sets. Day three proved to be the most exciting. Although the number one singles and number one doubles won easily the match still ended up all tied up at 2-2. The last match on the court was **Jane Ladrech** and **Ann Mullins**. They had lost the first and had a see saw second but finally came out on top. They got down 4-7 in the super tie break but they took

back the momentum and won!

WCRC Teams Enjoy "Fun" CCTA Matches

Seven (7) WCRC teams have completed the first month of the regular season play in the new Contra Costa Tennis Association (CCTA) league and have enjoyed team competition in a "lower stress" environment than USTA. The Men's 3.0 team, captained by **Stuart Levitas** are currently in second place in their division with a 1-1 record after a narrow 3-2 victory over Sleepy Hollow Swim & Tennis. The match was clinched in doubles, as **Tom Miller** and Levitas teamed for a 7-5, 6-1, which was followed by **Gerald Choi** and **Gary Mochizuki**'s 6-4, 7-6 win.

Gerry Brown's Men's 3.5 team met WCRC's "Strings" squad on August 24, with Brown's team prevailing 3-2. Highlights included Terry Thomas and Chuck Seymour's 6-4, 3-6, 7-5 win at #1 doubles over Roy Powell and Jon van Oosbree and a 6-3, 6-1 victory by the tandem of Craig Yen and Mike Joe at #3 doubles over Ray Thomas and Debashis Panda. The two WCRC teams currently stand in third and fourth place, respectively.

Of the four WCRC entries in the Women's 3.5 division, the biggest surprise might be **Carolyn Spady**'s "Loyal Ones", who have not dropped a match since the league's Kickoff Weekend on July 19-20. Their 4-1 record ties them for first place with the "Crowquettes" from Crow Canyon Country Club and includes a 3-2 win versus the **Carmen Duarte** led-Tiebreakers on August 2. Points were picked up by **Medora Weiser** with a straight set win at #2 Singles as well as the top two doubles lines - **Janet Neilsen/Robin Doyle** over **Debbie Hellmann/Carol Papke** 7-6, 6-7, 6-1 and **Debbie Wilson/Zorgi Ewing** over **Michelle Gold/Shirley Nagle** in an even closer match 6-7, 7-5, 7-5.

Susie Dunlap's "Creekers" sit alone in second place with a 3-0 record, while the Retrievers (3-2) captained by **Karen Hirtzel** are in good position to make a strong second half run. The regular season continues through the first week of October with the end-of-season team tournament scheduled for October 11-12 and 18-19 at St. Mary's College in Moraga.




