
Kent Lindeman

There is Even Love in the Bleachers at the Farm

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to start a new monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this new commentary.

any of us remember Kent Lindeman as not only an exceptionally talented tennis player and gifted organizer, but also an allaround nice guy. How did he find his way to Heather Farm and discover not only great people and lifelong friends but also love in the bleachers? Let's start from the beginning. Kent was born and raised in Hershey, Pennsylvania. His interest in tennis started with his mother who played and would go out with Kent to hit. She must have been an excellent instructor as Kent went on to play #1 singles and doubles for 2 years in high school. He actually helped organize the boy's team which didn't exist until he was a junior. Kent attended Bucknell University and although he tried out for the tennis team twice, he was not able to make the team (their loss!).





A couple years after graduating from college, Kent was in the wedding of his high school best friend which was being held in Yosemite National Park. He got to spend some time in the Bay Area and thought 'this place is amazing'. As luck would have it, Kent met a woman who was also in the wedding party and they began a long-distance relationship. He finally took the plunge and moved to California in 1996 where he took a job with HollandParlette, a nonprofit association management firm located in San Francisco. Kent became the owner of the company in 1999 and has run the company for over 20 years. His girlfriend at the time lived in Walnut Creek so that is naturally where he settled.

Once in Walnut Creek, it was easy for Kent to find his way to Heather Farm. One of the first people that he met at the Farm was Bobby Walgren who was working in the clubhouse. Bobby set up a few matches for Kent and he eventually got to know all the regulars. He played on a number of 4.5, 5.0 and 5.5 Men's USTA teams out of Heather. Although none of the teams made it past districts, the camaraderie and specialness of the Farm made it a unique and fun experience for Kent.

One day in 1998 Kent noticed a woman who was sitting on the bleachers and started a conversation with her. Janet had just finished a lesson with Fred Safipour and was

watching the action on Court 4. Love soon followed as did marriage and eventually 2 children (Kyle and Jenna who were both born at John Muir Hospital).

Primarily being a singles player and a natural organizer, Kent thought forming a singles league would work well for those looking for more competitive tennis. The singles league was founded by Kent and a few other players in 1998 with 48 men participating in its first season. The league grew to over 500 participants in the early 2000's with multiple men's and women's divisions and eventually spawned the doubles and mixed doubles leagues.

In 2000, Irv Pearlstein convinced Kent that he should serve on the WCRC Board. Although



reluctant at first, he eventually succumbed to Irv's persistence and became the vice president. He was the president in 2001 and brought with him some talented new blood, including Jennifer Scriabine, Tammy Chan, John Bondon, Claudia (Suh) Bown and Shari (Huber) Gonzalez. Kent's proudest WCRC moment came in 2002 when USTA NorCal named the WCRC "Community Tennis Association of the Year". Terrific achievement Kent!

Sadly for the WCRC, Kent and his family moved to Indianapolis in 2005 to be closer to Janet's family and raise their young children. Kent has continued to play USTA tennis and achieved one of his bucket list items in 2018 when his 40+ 4.5+ team made it to Nationals (congrats Kent – going to Nationals is on the bucket list of every competitive tennis player!). Kent's son Kyle is now a freshman at Purdue and daughter Jenna is a high school junior. His wife Janet works as a consultant for Clorox (has worked there for 25 years) and enjoys playing tennis a few times a week.

The past couple years Kent has been playing more pickleball than tennis. A friend convinced him to give it a try and he was hooked once he started playing tournaments. He has traveled around the country playing in tournaments and in 2019 won a Bronze medal at the US Open in Mixed Doubles Age 45 Open and then a Silver medal in Men's 35 4.5 Doubles at USAPA Nationals in Indian Wells. How fun is that!

Kent still thinks of Heather Farm and the WCRC regularly and has a Court Reporter newsletter collage that has been hanging in his home office since moving to Indy 15 years ago. We think of you as well Kent – thank you for all you did for the WCRC and tennis at Heather Farm. You are missed by many!

Baxter is training to become a Guide Dog for the Blind. Raisers keep the puppies for 2 years before they go to formal training in San Rafael.




