Janet Neilsen


You Play Football? Then You're Hired!

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to start a new monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this new commentary.

anet Neilsen was born in San Francisco and spent her early years in the Richmond District. She is a 3rd generation San Franciscan with family origins dating back to the 1860's. Her love of sports started early and she spent most of her free time down at the local playgrounds. The Helen Wills playground was one of her favorites where she played ping pong, basketball, tennis, football as well as other sports. The playground had a tennis court that you had to set up yourself by putting in the end posts and unrolling the heavy metal net; you had to be in shape to play tennis there! Janet bought a used wood racquet for \$2.98 and used white tennis balls for 10 cents each and thus began her tennis career.

Janet graduated from Galileo High School and got a job as a secretary. After a couple years, she applied for a job at the Underwriter's Salvage Company of New York. Janet filled out the job application with the usual information and on the back she responded to the



question about hobbies by listing all the sports she played. The gentleman that interviewed her read over her application and after turning it over asked her if she really did play football. Janet responded 'yes' and he responded 'you're hired'! As it turned out he was an All American halfback that played at USC and also in the pros by the name of Bill Howard.



After marrying, Janet moved to Piedmont where the family lived for 12 years. She has a son (Eric) and a daughter (Diane). After a few years Janet began playing tennis socially on the local courts. She was a good singles player so games were easy to set up. The family moved to Alamo in 1972 and joined the Round Hill Country Club. Janet played mostly singles on leagues and the ladder at Round Hill until 1982.

Janet is an enthusiastic snow skier and at age 22 she joined the San Francisco Vikings Ski Club. She has skied in Colorado, Utah, Canada, Idaho, Austria and California and celebrated her 80th birthday by skiing in Colorado. One of the many

highlights of her life was attending the 1960 Winter Olympics at Squaw Valley. She was lucky enough to have been given a ticket to the USA vs USSR hockey match which the US won. Janet is quick to point out that the US hockey team won gold for the first time at Squaw Valley (no, Lake Placid may have been the 'miracle on ice' but was not the first time the US won gold in hockey).

In 1979 Janet began working for the IBEW in San Jose and stayed with them for 20 years. There was lots of work in those days for electricians as the Silicon Valley boon was just beginning. Unfortunately it left little time for tennis although she was able to squeeze in some social tennis on the weekends. After retiring Janet began to play more and participated in USTA and league tennis.

Janet has captained BALL, Spring League and USTA teams for the past 20 years and is anxious to get back to captaining and playing (as we all are!). In the meantime, she is hitting tennis balls against her

garage door which fortunately is located at the end of a court so picking up stray balls is easy.

A highlight for Janet was attending the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles with her children. They saw Carl Lewis win a gold medal in track & field and set a world record at the same time. Janet's father was a big fan of track & field and would take the kids to events all around the Bay Area. She remembers seeing Bruce Jenner at one event.

Janet also remembers the end of WWII when she was a young girl and happened to be at the corner of 5th and Market in San Francisco. Workers began streaming out of office buildings and people were celebrating in the streets. Eventually a stranger helped her onto a street car and she made her way home. If she had only had a cell phone then to record all the festivities.



In the past, Janet has helped the Walnut Creek Racquet Club board by mailing out the newsletter and assisting at tournaments.

Thank you Janet and we hope to see you back out on the courts very soon.


