
The Philosophy of Tennis: Patrick Forden

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

to the game of tennis and applies many of the principles of a generally healthy and balanced life to his play on the court and to the numerous teams he leads. He spends a lot of time at the club, and feels that on the court he's so focused that everything else just fades away and he is freed from the miscellaneous preoccupations that otherwise clutter our minds and everyday lives. To Patrick the mental aspects of the game are just as important as the physical, and with practices three times a week, he works with his team members on things like their mental approach to the game and a strong commitment to good sportsmanship.

Patrick grew up in Fresno in the heart of the San Joaquin Valley and played recreational tennis as a kid, often hitting with his father (an avid competitor himself) in the agriculture-producing heat. His work as a newspaper and international magazine photojournalist brought Patrick to Reno and then



to San Francisco before he moved out to Walnut Creek in 2002 with his wife Wende and their two children Finn and Kajsa, then ages 2 and 8. While he hadn't been playing much tennis as an adult, when he moved to Walnut Creek he came out to Heather Farm to put his kids in youth tennis camps at the club, and joined some



drill classes himself with club pros Joe and Duncan. The drill classes, along with the people he met at the club and a new racket from the pro shop, spurred his desire to play more and in 2014 Patrick joined a 5.5 USTA combo team, followed by a 2.5 18 & Over team that went to Nationals in 2015. At that point Patrick decided to become a team captain himself, and he has now led over 45 USTA teams at Heather Farm. He took his own 3.0 team to Nationals in 2016, and as a non-playing captain, his 3.0 team to Nationals in 2021.


To Patrick, the competition of the game of tennis is a truly unique and exceptional endeavor that we are fortunate to be able to experience as players. He thinks USTA league play especially is unique in that every individual is competing in their own match as part of a unified team goal. For his 3.0 team that went to Nationals in 2016, Patrick

looked back over the regular and postseason results and determined that every single person on the team roster had at least one important victory that contributed to the Nationals run that season.

No longer working full-time as a photographer (although he is represented by Polaris Images and you may still find his work on Getty Images) Patrick is now exceptionally



busy as CEO of Percepticon, a Walnut-Creek



based company that provides comprehensive digital application solutions and innovation strategies. Percepticon recently overhauled the WCRC leagues website if you've noticed the changes there.

More than anything, Patrick loves the sense of community at WCRC, where everyone knows and respects one another regardless what level they play at, and we all work together and have fun doing so because we all love being there and participating in a unique and healthy common passion. But he



thinks it would be even better if Heather Farm had double the number of courts.

Looking to work on the philosophical side of your tennis game? Look for Patrick Forden at Heather Farm; he's usually there, he says, "still needing to work on my backhand", like so many of us at every level. •

SCHEDULING This is an open schedule. Players are responsible for scheduling their own

matches. Players will be provided with a contact list of participants within

their division.

MATCH FORMAT Best two-out-of-three set format.

A super tiebreaker can be played if all players agree, otherwise full third. Both teams responsible for bringing balls to match; winning team gets

the unopened can.

Matches should be played according to the "Rules of Tennis."

TOURNAMENT



End of season tournament with draw determined by league standings to be held over the weekend of Feb 3–5, 2023 dependent upon court scheduling and weather. To qualify for the tournament, teams must have completed and reported at least 2 matches during the regular league season. Depending on the number of entrants tournament play may include Friday night play. In addition, draws with large numbers of players may be required to play matches prior to the tournament weekend. Seeding for the tournament will be based on regular season standings of the top 4 teams in each divsion. The more matches you and your partner play, the higher your ranking will be. A minimum of 4 teams are required to generate a draw.

^{*} Teams with ratings more than 1 full step apart (i.e. 3.0 & 5.0 to make up an 8.0 team) are not eligible to play the end of season tournament.
