Since this is a complete resurfacing and only a few courts are being done at a time, the entire project is scheduled to be completed in mid-November. Because of the lack of courts until then, we will need to cancel our Mid-Summer tournament this year, unfortunately. But we'll be back next year, and I can't wait to see and play on the shiny new courts.

# Spotlight

### **Always Ready to Serve:**

### **Cameron Coltharp**

Interview and article by Ian McLaughlin

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

hances are that you already know WCRC member William Cameron "Cam" Coltharp because he's been coordinating the popular summer singles league for the club since 2012. "Almost everyone I regularly hit with I met through summer singles," says Cam, echoing a sentiment many of us can identify with. The program proved to be so popular that in 2020 Cam helped the club expand it by creating the "WING" singles league that runs during the Winter and Spring. Not surprisingly, Cam's favorite memories at the club stem from participating in and running the annual summer singles tournament, especially the after party and accompanying barbecues that bring club members together off the court.

Cam took his first tennis lesson as a youngster in Florida in 1978, then spent years "banging the ball against the wall" as his family migrated west to Martinez in 1980. While growing up in

Martinez Cam started hitting with friends at Golden Hills Park before playing for the Alhambra High School team. While attending



San Francisco State University and embarking on his career, Cam put down his racquet for almost twenty years before he picked it up again to hit with Richard Jung (also a WCRC member) who was a fellow cub scout dad.

As with so many WCRC members, it was unofficial club mayor Tammie Snyder who brought Cam into the Heather Farm community; she went out to Golden Hills park to hit with Cam one day, and then invited him out to one of her famously huge Monday practice sessions and introduced him to the other players in the WCRC community.

Cam doesn't play as often as he used to due to

lingering foot injuries, but he still gets out when he can, and that's often very early in the day for Cam, who's known as the "sunrise guy" for scheduling his matches very early before the busyness of the day becomes overwhelming.

Always busy, Cam is a dedicated family man who stepped up to become involved in many of the activities of his children Erin and Gavin, serving as a soccer coach and a cub scout leader during their upbringing.

Cam has been married to his wife Kate for nearly thirty years now, and remains close with his younger sister, nephews, and parents, so he's surrounded by family in the area even aside from his daughter Erin (who works in the field of environmental restoration) and son Gavin, who works in special education for the Piedmont school district. Cam himself has spent over two decades working in facilities and property management for Telecare, a multi state organization that provides inpatient and community programs to improve psychiatric and emotional health.

As is evident from this background, Cameron has always been willing to step up and serve in leadership positions both professionally and

in volunteer community organizations. If you've ever hit with Cam this won't be surprising to you, because the "sunrise guy" has always had a huge first serve. •




downright shamming. We had biggest our auction so far raking in \$ 4,565!

There was a lot of excellent tennis this year. I have attached the draws so you can see the results. I also have a pair of sunglasses if anyone left them. Please contact me directly.




















## Winners
