Tennis is a Family Affair:

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

or WCRC member Steve Lehmer, tennis is truly a family affair. Steve started playing the game about five years ago when his son Ryan asked if he wanted to hit; both had played some tennis in the past and were looking for a new sport and one they could play together. Ryan still plays often and Steve is currently at the selfdescribed "all you can eat" stage of his tennis career, playing 4~5 days a week in all formats and known to some of his friends as "the beast" for the amount of time he's on the court. Steve's wife Melissa Bach, whom Steve has known since middle school in Chico (they didn't really like each other much at first... it took a few years to grow on each other),



also started playing again recently after not hitting much since her high school tennis team days. One of the best tennis experiences so far was that Steve and Melissa got to share the travel and experience of both playing in the 55+ NTRP nationals earlier this year in Surprise, AZ.
