WCRC's membership is \$35 for new members and \$25 to renew every year thereafter. Membership works on a rolling twelve months so if you join in December, your renewal comes up the following December.

Our database keeps track of membership and sends a renewal reminder 30 days prior to renewal and then one additional reminder. For example, if you joined in December, your renewal would be sent in November. The system gives you 90 days from your renewal dated to pay the \$25, December in this example. If you don't renew within the 90 day period, again December +90 days = March, then the system drops your record and your membership lapses.

Being in "dropped status" means that if you want to maintain your membership, you will have to start again as a new member. This can be confusing because our system won't allow you to create a new membership using the same email as the one attached to the dropped status record. If you find yourself in this situation, you can contact our membership person, Pam Maloney, who can fix it so you can use the email you want.

We feel strongly that giving members 90 days is plenty of time to renew and so have a policy of not making any exceptions for members who have to start over.

If you find yourself at the clubhouse and need to renew there is a new QR code for you to scan and sign up right then and there!

Lastly, don't forget that we have household membership for tennis-playing families who have the same street address for no additional charge.



A Storybook Life: Nat Bitton

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

f you want to hear some fascinating tales about the origins of our famously social and inclusive tennis community at Heather Farm, all delivered in a delightful English lilt, you must seek out a conversation with WCRC member Nathan "Nat" Bitton. Nat was initially drawn to Heather Farm by an Oktoberfest event in 1983, and he says "there are no words" to describe how much fun it was to go to the Heather Farm tennis courts back in the day when it was a less structured tennis facility where he could drop in at almost any time, join a pickup tennis match, or just hang out and enjoy the warm camaraderie of the other players without any particular schedule or agenda, many of the same reasons WCRC members still love to come to Heather Farm.



Nat served as president of the club for a period in the

1980's, and with member AI Johns he started Friday night team tennis at Heather Farm, an event that he describes wistfully as filled with fun, food, friends, tennis, and incredible sunsets. Those events would often go until 11 p.m., underscoring the lively atmosphere at the courts at the time, and clearly foreshadowing the social culture that remains one of the hallmarks of Heather Farm. Nat and his friends also regularly played the precursor tournaments to what would later become USTA league



tennis but at the time was sponsored by Michelob beer. And when Nat says it was a blast to hang out at the courts in those early days you can take his word for it because Nat knows a thing or two about recreation, having spent a substantial amount of his adult life working at Club Med locations around the globe. In fact, he met his wife Bernadette in Moorea when she was on holiday at Club Med there while he was working.

Although Nat met numerous people through his work with Club Med, it's through the tennis community at Heather Farm that he made many lifelong friends that he still holds close. Starting in the 1980's, Nat, Bernadette, and their circle of friends would take an annual weekend trip to Boulder Creek Country Club, a tradition that continues to this day, even though injuries forced Nat to stop playing about a decade ago. He has now switched to golf, which is friendlier on the knees.

Nat grew up in London and played rugby at the Harrod's Rugby Club, which also featured tennis courts. Through his contacts at the Harrod's Club Nat started taking holidays at Club Med resorts around the world before eventually taking a position with the organization. Talk about an endless summer, Nat actually lived it.

Bernadette is from the Bay Area so they settled back in the East Bay, where they raised their daughters



Melissa and Alexandra. Both women still live in Northern California and the family remains close, including two granddaughters born to Melissa. Bernadette's family originally hails from Poland and they lost several family members at the Nazi death camps during World War II, and her family has always cherished their precious time together. Nat likes to say that he came from a close family and married into one as well. He still tries to return to the United Kingdom each year to see family and friends there, but otherwise he and Bernadette like to explore the unique treasures in our own backyard and spend time with their daughters and granddaughters.

Nat feels blessed to have lived the life he has and continues to create, and he relishes the lifelong friendships he made at Heather Farm. How many people can say that they have kept a tradition with friends going for almost five decades?, Nat can, and he claims that "Heather Farm made it all possible."

While Nat has truly lived a storybook life full of adventure and meaningful friendships, his priorities have always been the most fundamental things in life. As he puts it, " the Club Med lifestyle in the



70's and 80's was a dream, but it doesn't compare to being close to the people you love." Seek out a conversation with WCRC member Nat Britton and you'll receive all sorts of wisdom like that, and leave the conversation richer for it. •
