Giving Back While Cracking Jokes:

Doug Fish

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

f you're in the mood for a quick laugh and enjoy dad jokes, you should catch up with WCRC member Doug Fish because he's got an endless supply of them. But Doug's frequent wisecracks hardly mask his earnest desire to support the people and causes that are close to his heart.

Doug proudly proclaims that he's the only civilian in his family, as his father served in the Navy, his wife Fanny in the Air Force, and his daughters Lenore and Opal, both born in Israel, each performed their mandatory military service with the Israeli Defense Forces in Artillery and the Navy Seals. Although a lifelong civilian, Doug was living in Israel during the Gulf War in the "A zone", so he's familiar with living in an active war zone himself. Not surprisingly, supporting military veterans and their families is a very personal cause for Doug. In 2015, he completed a charity ride to support the Friends of the Israeli Defense Force (FIDF), cycling across Israel for six days to raise funds for adaptive cycling equipment and prosthetic sports devices for wounded veterans. Over the



course of six days they rode over 450 miles across Israel from the Lebanese border up to the Syrian border down the Egyptian border to the Red Sea for a total elevation gain of over 30,000 feet, higher than Mt. Everest. You'll often see Doug with his bike at Heather Farm as he trains. In his typically self-deprecating humor, Doug calls cycling his "excuse to wear Spandex in public."



Doug hails from Kansas City, which many people know for its famous BBQ but to Doug it's the city of four seasons and lightning bugs, which most of us have never seen other than the animation in the classic ride "Pirates of the Caribbean" at Disneyland. Doug studied chemical engineering and received his MBA at Washington University in St. Louis before forgoing a stint in the Peace Corps to volunteer in Israel. He met his future wife Fanny, an Israeli native while playing frisbee on the beaches of Tel Aviv. After their

courtship and eventual marriage, they settled in Tel Aviv and both of their daughters, Lenore and Opal, were born there. Doug refers to them as the "Irish twins" because they were born exactly one year "and twenty minutes" apart both on St. Patrick's Day. The family eventually migrated back to the United States and settled briefly in Boston before moving west to our beautiful NorCal weather and to fund another start-up. Doug has a sister in Lafayette so he was familiar with the Bay Area and felt a special attraction to Mt. Diablo because only the devil's weather could thaw them out from that last Boston Nor'easter!





Doug has far less tennis experience than most club members, in fact he's only started playing tennis at WCRC about fifteen years ago when Lenore was coaching kids with our former pro Coach Mac. Doug took readily to tennis but admits that his level of satisfaction in tennis greatly outpaces his skill level. Like most WCRC members Doug appreciates that we enjoy a special community of people at Heather Farm, not only competitive players but great individuals who support one another and our community through events like "The Longest Rally" organized by Euna, Glenn & Kevin to fund Alzheimer's research. Come out during the Summer Solstice this June to participate in the experience.

Doug plays a lot of USTA league tennis with WCRC, both 3.5 league and mixed doubles. He initially learned mixed doubles strategies from the ubiquitous Tammie Snyder, who gave him pro tips like "if your penis can touch the net, you're standing too close."

Doug worked in venture capital in Israel and has many a scar from his few start-up experience. Currently he is founder





of a financial advisory team at Merrill Lynch, where he says his job is to "help emotional people make rational decisions."

Besides tennis and cycling, Doug gardens as his personal therapy. His father was a master gardener back in Kansas City. He and Fanny live near Arbolado Park, and Fanny runs her own jewelry design

business in Walnut Creek, "Fanny Fish Designs." His oldest daughter, Lenore has settled nearby in Vacaville and works as a veterinary technician.

You frequently hear him called "fish fish", which a play on words since the Hebrew word for "fish" sounds very similar to "Doug."

Although always a jokester, Doug is quite serious about finding ways to help others, and based on his father's experience with Parkinson's Disease, Doug co-founded MyPersonal, Inc in the early days of the internet to create affinity groups to connect people who are experiencing similar kinds of trauma in their lives. Quite the clever idea since we were dialing up to the Internet on 56k baud modems and Myspace was the only fledging social media company at that time.

Doug's youngest daughter Opal lives in Tel





Aviv and is currently spending far too much time hunkered down in a bomb shelter during the current Israeli-Hamas war. Between that conflict and the fighting between Russia and Ukraine and elsewhere around the globe, Doug foresees a rising need for veterans' support in the coming years.

To quote lyricist Elvis Costello, what's so funny 'bout peace, love, and understanding? Just ask WCRC member Doug Fish. You'll get an answer and probably a dad joke as well.
