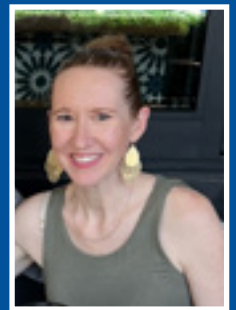

Member Spotlight

Working for the Weekend: Cy Lucas

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

WCRC member and 80's music aficionado Cy Lucas has been a consistent presence at Heather Farm since 2015, when he joined (and won) the club's popular "Summer Singles" league as a relatively new 3.0 player. Ever since then he's been playing USTA leagues through WCRC every year so he's often hanging out at Heather Farm until recently, when he has had to take a hiatus from tennis as he focuses on treating Mantle Cell Lymphoma, which was discovered by his medical team during a routine preventative colonoscopy in late 2023. Cy has taken on his recovery with the same approach that he uses in every other aspect of his life, employing every resource available to give his treatment plan the best chance for success, including radiation treatments, and a complete overhaul of his nutrition plan. The great news is that this multi-pronged treatment plan has proven effective thus far, as the latest scans indicate a significant reduction in the size of the tumor the doctors discovered in his abdomen.



Due to the intensity of the treatment protocols and the toll they take on his body, Cy plays very little tennis these days as he focuses on his care and spending time with the most important people in his life, his family.

While he loves the game of tennis, a serious health diagnosis has a way of putting everything into a new perspective, and Cy has taken it to heart. He continues to spend as much time as possible with his almost 13-year-old son Hunter, who is a huge Giants fan like his dad. They also love St. Mary's men's basketball (go Gaels!) and have season tickets for the Moraga hoopsters.

A Bay Area native, Cy grew up in San Mateo, playing some tennis for fun as a child with friends and his parents, and taking some lessons at the local courts. Cy stayed in San Mateo until the mid 1990's and began a lifelong career working in home based sales in the publishing industry for various companies, work he continues to this day from his home in Lafayette.

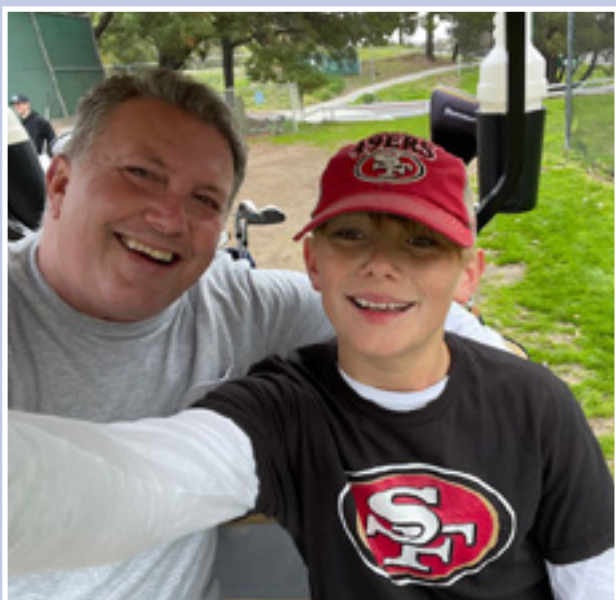
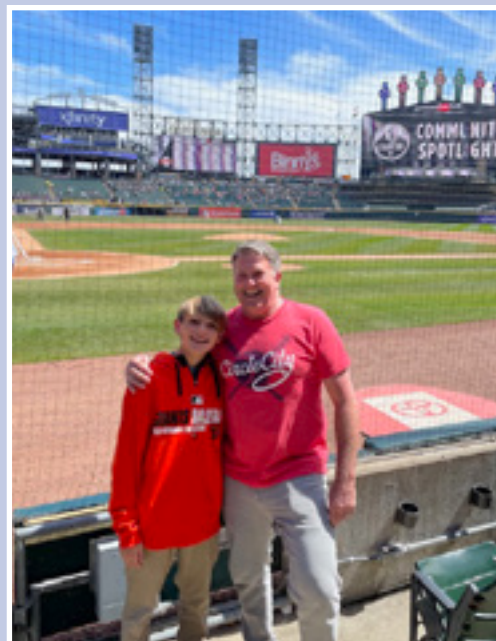
"Cy" is actually a shortened version of his full name, Cyrene Denison III. The family name derives from Simon of Cyrene, who was the person chosen by the Romans to carry Jesus of Nazareth's cross to the crucifixion site, an interesting historical factoid this author did

not know prior to preparing this spotlight article.

Cy didn't really play tennis from his childhood rec days until 2013, when he moved out to Walnut Creek from San Francisco and was dating a woman who played at Valley Vista. He picked up the racquet again and chose Heather Farm as his home venue due to its popularity in the tennis community that he learned about through word of mouth, prompting him to join Summer Singles through WCRC and become part of the tennis community here. One of Cy's initial fond memories at the club was taking second place with Becky Reiss in the club's signature Calcutta tournament, a well-attended event that is an annual favorite for so many WCRC members.

Heather Farm also holds a special place in Cy's heart because he moved to the area as an adult and he works mostly from home, so many of the friendships Cy has developed in this area are through tennis, including many close friends who have remained steadfastly at his side during his recent challenges. As much as Cy would love to get out and play more often and hang out with his buddies, (although he passes on the post-match beers now) his top priority is to focus on his treatment so that he will hopefully continue to make progress and be able to watch Hunter grow up.

The takeaway for all of us from Cy's journey is that prevention matters when it comes to managing your health, so don't neglect your regular health exams, in addition to living a healthy lifestyle. A huge mahalo to WCRC member Cy Lucas for sharing his story with the tennis community for this important reminder as he battles a new and unexpected opponent. Whip it, Cy, whip it good. ▲

Sonja Christopher, first person voted out of Survivor, dies at 87

Sonja (Shumaker) Christopher was a past WCRC Member. Christopher made show history as the first to have her torch snuffed by host Jeff Probst on "Survivor: Borneo" in 2000. [Sonja Christopher](#), the first person to be voted out of [Survivor](#), died on Friday at 87, Entertainment Weekly has confirmed. A cause of death was not disclosed.



Christopher, a former music therapist, competed on the reality competition's first season, Survivor: Borneo, at 63 years old in 2000. She won over fans and fellow competitors when she attempted to boost her tribe's morale by playing the ukulele and singing «Bye Bye Blues» to eventual winner Richard Hatch before she was voted out at Tribal Council, making Survivor history as the very first person to get their torch snuffed by host [Jeff Probst](#).

"Sonya [sic] was one of the kindest people to ever play Survivor," Probst said in statement on the show's [Instagram account](#) on Saturday. «Every interaction I had with her over the years was lovely. She would always greet you with a smile on her face and joy in her heart. I'm honored that our paths got to cross.

News of Christopher's death first broke on Friday, with multiple Survivor players sharing tributes to her on social media. «She paved the way for every person to ever play Survivor," [Rob Cesternino](#), who finished in third place in season 6's Survivor: The Amazon, [wrote on X](#). "We will always smile when we think of Sonja Christopher. RIP to a legend."

[Liz Wilcox](#), who is currently competing on season 46, shared a photo [on X](#) of her recent meeting with Christopher. "Today, the legend herself Sonja Christopher of Season One passed away," Wilcox wrote. "I had the pleasure of meeting her on Christmas. She had so much spunk + love for Survivor and what the show brought to her life. I hope you're singing + playing your heart out somewhere beautiful, Sonja. »

Christopher competed on Survivor just three years after battling invasive breast cancer. «I was newly recovering from breast cancer treatment. And I had been in a 11-year relationship and my partner got consolation elsewhere during that time of the cancer,» [Christopher previously told EW](#). "So I had moved to a senior retirement community, and I was by myself, no ties, my son was grown and taking care of himself. I was reading the morning paper, and it said something in an article about CBS looking for 16 Americans to cast away on a deserted island and see who could survive for 39 days."

After she struggled in the first challenge, the Tagi tribe voted her out on day three. "I had mixed feelings, that's for sure," Christopher told EW about her exit 20 years later. "I was pretty beaten up... To this day, I still have bruises that don't go away... Someone once asked me if I thought my being voted off early was due to ageism. And I said, 'Oh, no.' And you know why is because I had no concept of ageism. I was always good at sports and very active physically. I just didn't realize I was, to some of these people, an old lady."



In 2017, Christopher revealed that she was still Survivor's biggest fan in [a video shared on social media](#). "I may have the dubious distinction of being the first person ever voted off Survivor, but I have not missed one episode watching it in the past 17 years," she said. "I've recently turned 80 and I intend to watch the next 17 years of Survivor, and then I can happily hike off to the giant Tribal Council in the sky. I hope they don't vote me off."

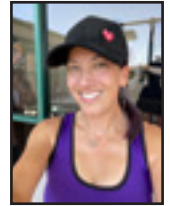
