Member Spotlight

When You Know You Know & Daisy Too: Lena Larionova & Chris Lau

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

This story doesn't start like some of the others, as it all began in lands far, far away...

And yet it ends, for the moment, like many of the others, here, on the tennis courts at Heather, with so many friends, and a dog named Daisy

Lena was born in (the) Ukraine where her father was a tennis coach for the Soviet Union, teaching and traveling to train players. She also had a godsister, Lina Krasnorutskaya, a former top 25! So that's where it all started.... Well, a little bit. Her family came to Canada when she was 8 to the greater Toronto and Hamilton area, and there she played on the high school team a bit she says, and she knew, a little.

Chris was born in Hong Kong. When he turned 1, his family picked up and moved to Canada to join other family members. They moved to a suburb of Toronto, Mississauga. Chris didn't play tennis when he was young, he was focused on his academics, in which he excelled. When he wasn't studying, he was often tutoring others. No time for tennis, but that would come once he made his way to University. He didn't know... yet

Both Lena and Chris studied at University of Waterloo, just outside of Toronto and Hamilton. And it was there that they found tennis, and then, each other. They joined, independently, the Universities' tennis club for some recreational tennis and soon ran into each other. One thing led to another, and they knew, they knew they wanted some more, tennis that is...

The program at University of Waterloo was a rigorous 5 year, year round curriculum. The compelling aspect included an intern program which helped propel both Lena and Chris into their professional careers, Chris as a Software Engineer and Lena as a Technical Writer of software, and almost immediately brought them to California.

Their first stop in California took them to San Francisco, and their tennis to the Bay Club. Their stay there lasted a few years, they met some notable tennis people, players, captains and friends, but the search for a quieter life brought them to the Creek. Their life with work and tennis kept them busy and they quickly found themselves wrapped into the wonderful all encompassing life at Heather, but they wanted something more.



They had spent several years together without some of the formal steps along the way, because they knew what they wanted. In 2018 while apart from each other and with Chris in Europe, it happened, they decided it was time to get married. So Chris fired off a text and the union was soon thereafter solidified.

Then came the “BIG” decision, do we get a dog? Of course, they set off on the quest for the perfect pup. Then along came Daisy! They knew it as soon as they saw her, the perfect dog for them. Daisy made a long trip from Taiwan to a rescue group in San Jose, and then to Chris and Lena, and Daisy knew she found her furever family... Next, they needed a place to call their own, big enough for Daisy and enough space for them both to work from home. And someplace near the tennis they loved. So of course they found a place within walking distance of the courts at Heather, 2 weeks later the deal was in place.
