Making the Most of the Hand He Was Dealt:

Shankar Krishna

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

Poker players will tell you that it's not about the cards you are dealt, it's how you play the hand that matters most, and WCRC member Shankar Krishna embodies this principle through the way he has lived his life and conducts himself. One thing you might not have known about Shankar, even if you've played tennis with him or hung out at the courts, is that he used to do stand-up comedy. He does bring some of his material to the court as well, however, jokingly excusing his errant shots by saying simply that "shank is in my name", as if it's up to the fates at that point.

That same self-deprecating sense of humor, along with a stoic pragmatism and mental strength he gained in part from his mother while growing up in India, has helped Shankar consistently win with the challenging hand he was dealt when he contracted polio at age one. He says with typical stoicism that "the virus got to me before the vaccine did," because there was a critical polio vaccine shortage in India at the time.

Contracting polio at such a young left Shankar with almost no use of one leg for most of his life, and now with tongue-in-cheek he compares his atrophic leg to a 'lamppost for a drunkard', there only for support and little else. Nonetheless, Shankar and his family did not let his physical impairment hold him back in life catalyzed by his determined and strong mother who took him to physiotherapy

often, and after some surgical procedures. Shankar loved to play cricket while growing up, anywhere and everywhere he could, from streets and alleys to his school. In fact, after he emigrated to the United States, he played cricket with prolific WCRC tennis captain KK" (Kranthi Tappita), who happened to work in the same building, and KK was one of the influences that initially drew Shankar to Heather Farm and USTA.

Shankar grew up in the city of Chennai in Southern India, and completed all of his schooling in India except for taking some courses in Marketing through the UC Berkeley extension program after he moved to the United States, eventually earning his MBA. As per Indian custom, Shankar and his wife Sudha wed in 1997 through an arranged marriage. When Sudha accepted a position with AirTel (now Verizon) in Concord, Shankar moved with her from India directly to Concord. Shankar and Sudha have raised their family here. Their elder daughter Mira, age 17, is currently a senior at Northgate High School, where she plays varsity tennis. Son Vishnu is a freshman at Northgate and

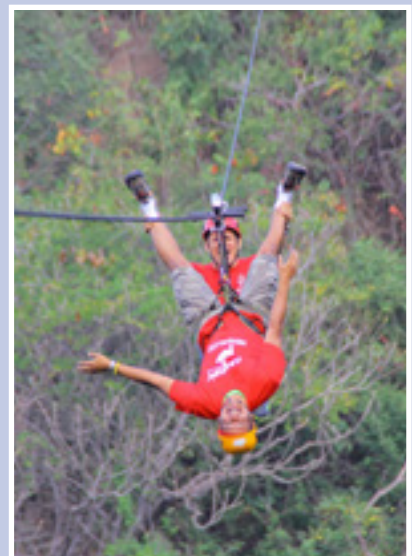


also plays tennis there. In a family of athletes, Sudha is an avid hiker, which she's done all over the world, including Machu Picchu and hiking from rim-to-rim in the Grand Canyon. She's also trekked to Mt. Everest base camp, which is located at an elevation of nearly 18,000 feet. So Sudha is ready and willing to tackle epic treks. Shankar doesn't join her for those adventures, but they also do plenty of hiking as a family, exploring the natural beauty and bounty we have right here in our own backyard.

Professionally, Shankar heads Ideaon, a small company that has been operating in Concord for over twenty years, which creates employee development and training courses with a specific focus on ADA compliant courses, particularly for the visually challenged. Although the Americans With Disabilities Act legally requires equal access for persons with disabilities, from talking to Shankar about his work you can tell that he's really in it for the justice and dignity that equal access provides for persons with physical and visual limitations.

Prior to 1999 Shankar had never played any tennis, which is still an elite sport in India and not as widely accessible as it is here in the U.S. In need of a new sport since cricket isn't as readily available in the U.S. as it is in India, in 1999 shortly after emigrating to the East Bay, Shankar decided to pick up tennis, which draws upon many of the same physical skills he used in cricket. With his sporting background, Shankar took readily to tennis and began to play often with a small group he convened regularly at the courts near his house in Concord. But as happens so often with the warmly inclusive tennis community at Heather Farm, eventually he was drawn in like a moth to light, and he started playing at Heather Farm more often, and also started playing USTA league tennis (Kevin Kyono was his first captain). He has been competing in USTA leagues ever since - went up to a 4.0 (3.5 now) - made sectionals a few times. Despite her athletic background, Sudha does not play tennis, but has recently picked up pickleball. Shankar sarcastically says that she must have gone over to the dark side.

More than anything, Shankar's life is a testament to the fact that with the right mindset, a physical disability need not prevent you from living your best life. In addition to playing cricket and tennis, successfully running a small business, and raising a family, in 2018 Shankar decided to challenge himself further and completed the Walnut Creek half- marathon (over 13 miles). He's the first to admit

it might not have been the wisest choice, but since Sudha was planning to do the run, Shankar signed up on a lark, because after a lifetime of meeting challenges head-on, it seemed like an appropriate goal so he went for it. He made the entire distance, although Sudha did beat her husband to the finish line, no surprise there.

When he discussed what he enjoys about playing tennis at Heather Farm, like just about every person who has appeared in a "member spotlight" article, for Shankar what's most important is the quality of the people at the club, who are so supportive of one another and so inclusive. From his own unique perspective, Shankar says that he's never felt judged by anyone at the club due to his physical disability, nor inferior

to anyone, which is a testament both to

Shankar's strong mindset and to the genuinely compassionate community of high character individuals at WCRC. Creating friendships and relationships at Heather Farm has been most enriching and is the highlight for Shankar's WCRC membership. ▲

WCRC was well represented at this year's USTA NorCal 18+ Grand Prix Tournament, the culmination of the 2024 NTRP tournament season with bids to NTRP Nationals on the line. Our club's strong presence was highlighted by the complete sweep of all 3 mixed doubles events – 3.5, 4.0, and 4.5! The duo of Steph Stieber and Alex Baier teamed up to take home the 4.5 mixed draw, while Steve Lehmer paired with his trusty tournament partner, Valerie Pietrasz, to dominate the 4.0 mixed draw. On the 3.5 mixed side, Brian Hennessy joined forces with Jasmine Morgan to secure their spot in Nationals, while Kayla Baier and Chris Alexander navigated their way to a respectable 4th place. Over in the singles side of things, Steph Stieber commanded her way to a 4.5 singles title, while only dropping a total of 6 games over 6 sets. 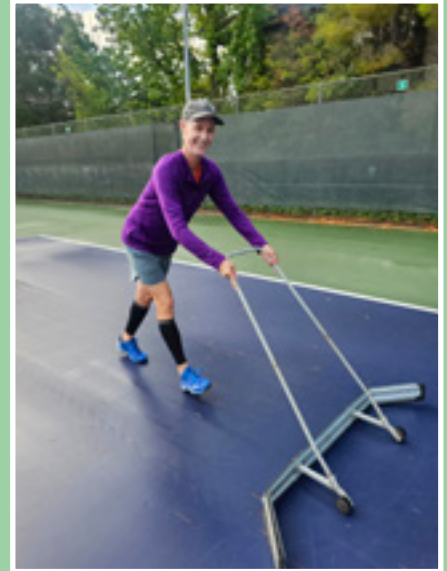
Thank you to everyone who donated to the Mt. Diablo High School Tennis Program. David Pintado graciously brought all of our donations to the much needed club!

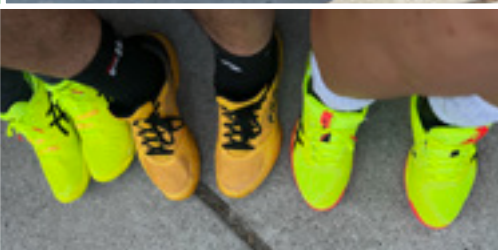
We look forward to another successful Calcutta next spring!

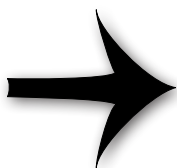

Both teams responsible for bringing balls to match; winning team gets the unopened can.
Matches should be played according to the "Rules of Tennis."

TOURNAMENT End of season tournament with draw determined by league standings to be held over the weekend of Mar 7–9, 2025 dependent upon court scheduling and weather. To qualify for the tournament, teams must have completed and reported at least 2 matches during the regular league season. Depending on the number of entrants tournament play may include Friday night play. In addition, draws with large numbers of players may be required to play matches prior to the tournament weekend. Seeding for the tournament will be based on regular season standings of the top 4 teams in each division. The more matches you and your partner play, the higher your ranking will be. A minimum of 4 teams are required to generate a draw.



* Teams with ratings more than 1 full step apart (i.e. 3.0 & 5.0 to make up an 8.0 team) are not eligible to play the end of season tournament.

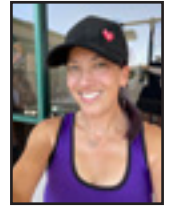
