Member Spotlight

Always Dancing & Smiling:

Kathleen “Pru” Pruden

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column “Member Spotlight”. We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

It was quite a while ago that three little girls met in Atlanta, Georgia. These eight year old girls, Kathleen and twin sisters, Linda and Maureen became lifelong friends and it was the twins who decided that their new friend was going to be “Prudy”. As they got older, Prudy became Pru (which she’s very happy about) and that’s how all of us at WCRC know the ever smiling Pru!

Pru stayed in Atlanta working for Kmart for 12 years near her Mom and brother Hank until 1982 when Moe, as Maureen came to

be called, had a baby. Auntie Pru got on a plane for a visit to see her “adopted” family. The twins had both married and with Moe’s new baby in the picture, they ganged up on her until she agreed that moving to California was what she needed to do.

A big part of Pru’s life in Atlanta surrounded her passion for dance. She did a little bit of everything but her talent was best suited for modern and jazz dance. Although she didn’t start dancing until she was in her early 20s she was good enough to be active in competitive dancing. Had she begun dancing at a younger age, she might have been able to make it her career. The move to California ended her competitive dance days but she continued with dance classes for many years. She has participated in a flash mob and along with her regular Zumba instructor was able to take a dance class with Louis van Amstel, a professional dancer from Dancing With The Stars. Now you know where Pru’s email address, Dancewench, comes from!

Upon arriving in California, Pru took a job with Linda’s husband in solar hot water where she worked for a few years. Without dance taking up all of her free time, Pru’s California family got her interested in tennis. She took a few lessons and ended up playing out of Pleasant Hill, like so many of us. That eagle eye, Gerry Brown, met Pru and quickly recruited her to play on his mixed team out of Walnut Creek. Since mixed doubles was what she began with, that game holds a special place for her, as does her first mixed



partner, Francis Cruzit.

Moving her tennis playing to Walnut Creek opened up lots of opportunity for Pru to play as much tennis as she wanted. By the late 90s she was playing evenings and weekends where she has played for captains Myra Kan, Lisa Italia and Tammie Snyder to name a few. She tried her hand at singles but found she preferred the strategy of doubles where she focused her attention. Pru was drawn to the camaraderie



of being on a team and hanging out with fun, energetic people while still having a competitive activity. She has developed many friendships through tennis and you will often see her hanging out to watch them compete when not playing herself.



Pru participates in almost every activity WCRC offers. She's played in the Calcutta tournament almost every year and won the Consolation round one year with Alan Chan. She always heads a consortium to buy teams playing in the Calcutta that has often won her and her co-owners some cash. She participates in WCRC doubles leagues in both the women's and mixed seasons and has played with a mix of fun,

talented partners. Then, of course, there's USTA where she competes on women's, combo and mixed teams, making it to Sectionals many times and once to Nationals with her 55+ 7.0 team. Pru does admit that 8.0 mixed is still her favorite league though!

In between tennis and dance Pru loves gambling and playing games. She and a close friend have made multiple trips over the years to Las Vegas where her games of choice are Pai Gow and 3 card poker along with a sprinkling of slot machine play. Locally she plays Shanghai, bridge, poker, bocce and a bit of pickleball with friends.



Ever looking for a new challenge, Pru moved into the mortgage lending business until the financial crisis of 2008 blew that business into pieces. Then, through a tennis acquaintance, Scott Hagen, she was introduced to a small business bank start up where she stayed for 11+ years until that bank was acquired by a larger bank and

COVID turned that business world upside down. Pushed into early retirement, Pru hasn't looked back.

National Champions!

On November 8-10, the 4.5 18+ women's team out of Heather Farms represented Northern California at the USTA National Championships in Surprise, Arizona. It was a weekend we'll never forget, full of both stress, challenges, and grit, and also laughter, celebration, and support for each other.

We came into the tournament hopeful but cautious. This would be the toughest tennis any of us have played at USTA, so we knew we'd have to bring it our all to even stand a chance. On Friday, we started out strong with a 4-1 win against PNW, and then kept it going with a 5-0 sweep against Missouri Valley. We were on top of the world! Our singles players were fresh and hungry, our doubles strong.

Then, Saturday came and with it, the 40+ reigning national champions: Southern. This match was a wake up call, and a reminder of how tough the tennis at Nationals really is. Southern beat us here 1-4.



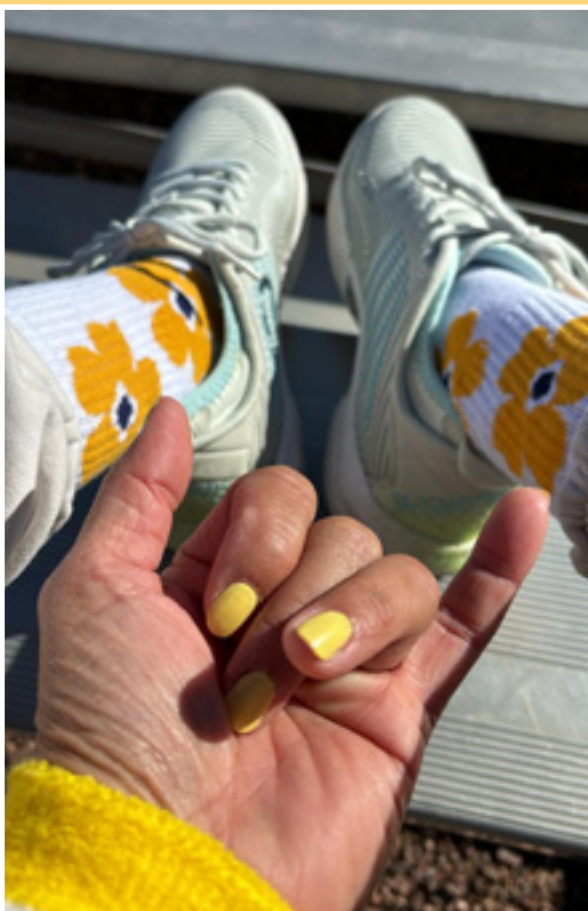

But the team rallied and didn't let the loss get us down: we had to sweep the next team to even stand a chance of getting into the semis - and we did! Intermountain never stood a chance.

On Sunday morning, we faced New England, the 1st place team, and again just barely made it through with close matches and a 3-2 win. So it all came down to Sunday finals: the showdown of the

Californias. At this point, our players were all tired, injured, and worn down, but the fire was burning in our bellies and we knew we'd go down fighting no matter what. A strong singles beatdown from Bomy got us a clean win, then a tiebreak win on D1 from Lena and Laura, and suddenly it was 2-2 and we were all watching Noa and Chandra fighting for the gold. Chandra had rolled her ankle early in the match, and Noa had taken a bad





hit against the fence running down a ball. Our players were hurt, on their (literal) last legs, and they got their opponents to a third set tiebreak. Suddenly, it was like they came to life again, and we could see the fire in their eyes. They'd been here before; they knew they could do it! And with the renewed strength and drive, Noa and

Chandra fought for every point in the tiebreak, taking it home for Northern California and our own Heather Farms community.

Cristina and I can't express how grateful we are to this wonderful team. It started out a bit haphazardly: as new 4.5s that just wanted to play lots of tennis, we reached out to so many people, just hoping for a few to agree. As every new player said yes to us, we realized what an amazing group we had, and that we had the chance to go all the way. Thank you all for trusting us, for having each other's backs, and for coming along on this unforgettable journey.

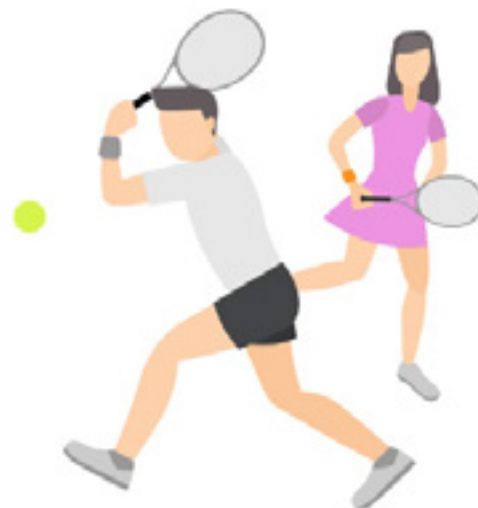
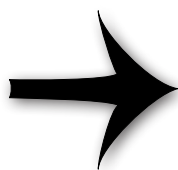

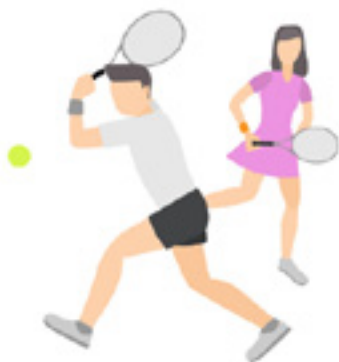
FORMAT Mixed Doubles
(players grouped by combined NTRP level; ie. 7.0 can be a 4.0 man and a 3.0 woman or two 3.5 players)

NTRP LEVELS Mixed 6.0–9.0*

SCHEDULING This is an open schedule. Players are responsible for scheduling their own matches. Players will be provided with a contact list of participants within their division.

MATCH FORMAT Best two-out-of-three set format.
A super tiebreaker can be played if all players agree, otherwise full third.
Both teams responsible for bringing balls to match; winning team gets the unopened can.
Matches should be played according to the "Rules of Tennis."

TOURNAMENT End of season tournament with draw determined by league standings to be held over the weekend of Mar 1–2, 2025 dependent upon court scheduling and weather. To qualify for the tournament, teams must have completed and reported at least 2 matches during the regular league season. Depending on the number of entrants tournament play may include Friday night play. In addition, draws with large numbers of players may be required to play matches prior to the tournament weekend. Seeding for the tournament will be based on regular season standings of the top 4 teams in each division. The more matches you and your partner play, the higher your ranking will be. A minimum of 4 teams are required to generate a draw.



* Teams with ratings more than 1 full step apart (i.e. 3.0 & 5.0 to make up an 8.0 team) are not eligible to play the end of season tournament.

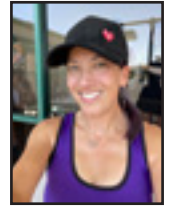
