Shining Light for All to See:

Hannah Nuri

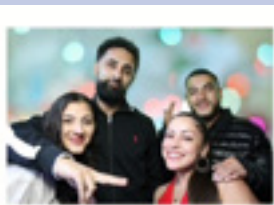
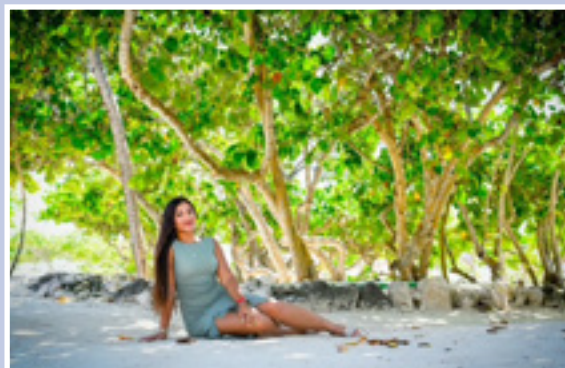

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

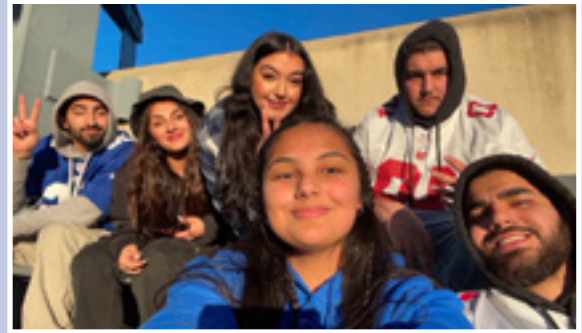
If you play tennis at Heather Farm, chances are you already know Hannah Nuri, who is a steady presence who does it all for Lifetime Activities in the office, everything from making reservations and scheduling courts to helping players identify the right classes for them and stringing racquets. So Hannah is a primary interface with Lifetime Activities for many players

at Heather Farm, and it's also very likely that your interactions with her have left you smiling, because she tends to look for the good in all people and events in life and radiates her positivity on everyone who crosses her path. Like her office mate and best friend Ciara Mendoza, Hannah is an old soul housed in a young body, and her maturity comes in large part from her family and her faith. Hannah's family emigrated to the United States from Afghanistan, and while her father's siblings dispersed across the country, most of her mother's siblings live in the Bay Area and maintain close relationships and spiritual ties based on their Muslim Islamic heritage. Names are particularly important in Hannah's family, and her mother's name "Stoorai" means "star", so she goes by the name Starr, which flows naturally from her grandmother's name "Spozmi", which means "moon". Hannah's own name means "beautiful happy ending", and was bestowed upon her by her grandfather. As the elder sibling in her immediate family, Hannah naturally assumed a leadership role within her family at a young age, and drew strength from the example set by her hardworking mother, a nurse at

John Muir hospital who gave birth to Hannah after her water broke while at the hospital as she was working her shift. ("My mother went straight from her nurse's scrubs to a hospital gown", Hannah jokes.) Like her mother, Hannah's father was also well educated and as an engineer who specialized in underwater bridge work, he helped rebuild the Bay Bridge after the catastrophic 1989 Loma Prieta earthquake caused



its partial collapse. When a severe tragedy befell their family about a decade ago, Hannah lost both her father and her younger sister and she was forced to call upon the strength she learned from her mother to then become a source of stability for her mom. As the tragic events unfolded, one weekend morning Hannah was out for a routine bike ride near their family home with her father and younger sister Hadees, who herself was named after one of the most important books in Islam after the Quran. Unfortunately a careless driver



on Treat Boulevard careened off the road and hit all three cyclists. If you lived in the Diablo area a decade ago you might recall the collision, which was widely publicized in the local media. While Hannah survived, her father and sister were pronounced dead at the scene. The collision was close enough to their house that her mother heard the loud crash and the sirens and said a quiet prayer, "god help that family", without knowing it was her own family that was run down



by a careless, speeding driver. At the time Hannah was only 11 years old, and her sister was 9. After her mother lost her husband and younger daughter so tragically, Hannah felt she needed to become a "rock" of stability for her grieving mother, which seems a natural role given her maturity, love of family, and inherently responsible nature.

Hannah also derived an indomitable work ethic from her hardworking parents, and has been working steadily since age 14, even while she attended Clayton Valley

High School before and during its transition to a charter school. At Clayton Valley High Hannah played soccer, which was her sport of choice as a child.

Even as a young worker primarily in the retail food industry, Hannah was elevated to the management ranks in every job she's ever held, until she purposely took a "regular" job with Lifetime Activities because the role of manager is so taxing, particularly for someone who is younger than the people they're managing. Coincidentally, Hannah was a manager at a local Wingstop Franchise when she met Ciara, who managed a different Wingstop franchise in the area herself. Ciara and

Hannah quickly became close friends, both being old souls with similar values, and it was Ciara who recommended Lifetime Activities to Hannah when a

position opened up after Ciara was already working with Lifetime. That was in 2021, and Hannah has been with Lifetime Activities at Heather Farm ever since.

Like every person who has been interviewed for a "member spotlight" article, Hannah stressed how much she values the community of people at Heather Farm, which she refers to as a "melting pot of love." In particular she notes how fortunate we are to be engaged with such a compassionate, inclusive community of people that comprise WCRC's membership, people who genuinely care for one another as people, not just tennis colleagues. She cites an example of Cara Mia Baracascel, a ubiquitous presence at WCRC and amateur gourmet chef, one day bringing some homemade food to the club and bringing along a pork-free dish specifically for Hannah because Cara Mia had heard that Hannah's Muslim faith prohibits her from eating pork. And although there are a large number of players clamoring to share the limited court space at Heather Farm, Hannah says the WCRC "regulars" understand the staff's dilemma in allotting precious court space and help ease staff's burden by working it out among themselves to the extent possible. Several times during the interview Hannah mentioned by name Tammie Snyder, who is the straw that stirs the drink at Heather Farm, and how much she values both Tammie's steady leadership as a prolific captain/court user and her friendship off the courts. Hannah was scheduled to work on a Monday on her very first day at Lifetime Activities just so she could bear witness to one of Tammie's famously huge Monday afternoon practices and meet a broad swath of the club membership.

Always an achiever, Hannah has her sights set on her next goal in life, which is to follow in her mom's footsteps and become a nurse herself. Hannah has earned her A.A. degree and is planning to pursue her nursing degree next, and hopes to study nursing at Samuel Merritt College. One thing is certain, when she does become a nurse, Hannah will bring a tremendous amount of joy to the patients she treats, just as she spreads light for everyone to see when they come to the courts at Heather Farm. That kind of bedside manner cannot be taught in school, it's an inherent quality some old souls with strong families and faith just have deep within them. ▲

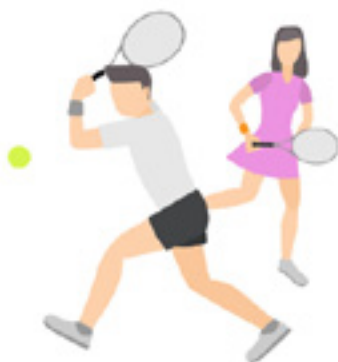
FORMAT Mixed Doubles
(players grouped by combined NTRP level; ie. 7.0 can be a 4.0 man and a 3.0 woman or two 3.5 players)

NTRP LEVELS Mixed 6.0–9.0*

SCHEDULING This is an open schedule. Players are responsible for scheduling their own matches. Players will be provided with a contact list of participants within their division.

MATCH FORMAT Best two-out-of-three set format.
A super tiebreaker can be played if all players agree, otherwise full third.
Both teams responsible for bringing balls to match; winning team gets the unopened can.
Matches should be played according to the "Rules of Tennis."

TOURNAMENT End of season tournament with draw determined by league standings to be held over the weekend of Mar 1–2, 2025 dependent upon court scheduling and weather. To qualify for the tournament, teams must have completed and reported at least 2 matches during the regular league season. Depending on the number of entrants tournament play may include Friday night play. In addition, draws with large numbers of players may be required to play matches prior to the tournament weekend. Seeding for the tournament will be based on regular season standings of the top 4 teams in each division. The more matches you and your partner play, the higher your ranking will be. A minimum of 4 teams are required to generate a draw.



* Teams with ratings more than 1 full step apart (i.e. 3.0 & 5.0 to make up an 8.0 team) are not eligible to play the end of season tournament.
