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THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Happy February!

I was recently reminded about a story I heard from Tammie last year about a match she was in, and it got me thinking, so I'm going to go off schedule this month to write about it.

Tammie got into a disagreement with an opponent about yelling out things like "short" or "look out" while the ball is in play – more specifically while

the ball was heading towards Tammie's side of the court, potentially causing a hindrance. Tammie warned her opponent about it while referencing the USTA rulebook, while her opponent said that (insert teaching pro's name here) said the exact opposite.

That got me thinking – just because they're a tennis pro (whether it's ATP, WTA, or teaching) or a pro at any sport doesn't necessarily mean they know all the rules. That's why we have referees and umpires. Part of the reason why refs and umps are there is to enforce the rules; you know, the same rules that pros sometimes try to bend or break (intentionally or unintentionally) throughout the course of a match or game.

This reminds me of Donovan McNabb, an all-pro QB for the Philadelphia Eagles in the 2000's, and there was one game he played in that ended in a tie. During the postgame press conference, he famously stated that he didn't know that an NFL game can end in a tie. Donovan McNabb, an NFL all-pro quarterback, didn't know that if you play overtime and no one scores in OT, that the game ends in a tie? Anyone who follows the NFL knows this!

This is no slight against teaching pros. We have some great teaching pros who do a fantastic job at teaching us fundamentals, mechanics, and basic rules and scoring. But that doesn't necessarily mean that they know ALL the rules. While they're a good source for knowledge, it's always best to refer to the rulebook (or an official) if you can. Sometimes pros get it wrong, too. And in Tammie's specific case, the pro that her opponent was referring to was wrong as well.

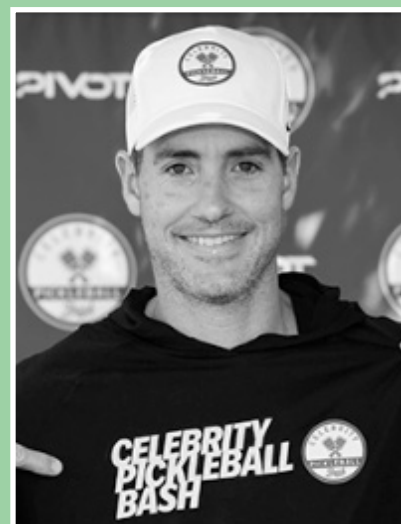


Exclusive John Isner Meet & Greet

An Artist Who's Not Just Monkeying Around:

Patrick Wong

As an effort to get to know our membership the Board has decided to have a monthly column "Member Spotlight". We will be interviewing WCRC members and getting to know them. This article will help us find out how they got introduced to tennis, their background, any favorite memories, etc. We hope you enjoy this commentary.

You'd be hard pressed to find someone with a more eclectic and classical array of interests than WCRC member Patrick Wong. His range of professional and personal activities is quite varied and incredibly broad.

A true art lover and Renaissance man, Patrick pursued his undergraduate degree at Cal State Hayward (since rebranded as CSU East Bay) specifically so that he could study the fine arts of painting and ceramics under two well known artists there, Mel Ramos and Enrique Chagoya. In his free time, Patrick plays bass in a local band called "The Trouble With Monkeys", a tribute band that specializes in "rocked out" versions of songs by the 1960's pop group



"The Monkees", although Patrick humbly says that he's not a real musician and can't read music, and that he only learned how to play bass when he was working on a magazine article (one of his many past gigs) about a fantasy band camp for adults. Despite his humility about his musical ability, Patrick did earn

a check for \$1.73 from BMI when a musical artist in the United Kingdom used one of his bass lines from a recording session, so technically he is a professional musician.

Patrick is a local boy who was raised in Lafayette, where he attended Campolindo High School and although his parents have passed, he and his older brother Stuart remain close and both reside in Lafayette, where they are remodeling their old family home.

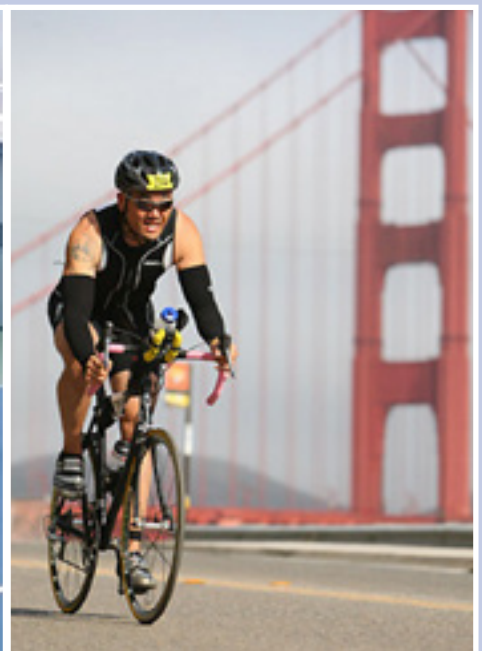
Patrick's interest in the arts probably stems from his father, who worked in the advertising industry in San Francisco at a time when



Patrick describes the advertising business as very much like it is portrayed in the popular TV series “Mad Men”, with lots of after-work socializing and cocktails at the nearby hangout “Cathay House.” Patrick accompanied his father there often and also entered the advertising industry himself when he joined Goodby Silverstein and Partners, the advertising agency that created the famous “got milk” campaign. When Patrick returned to Cathay House with his own advertising colleagues once, one of the bartenders actually remembered him since he had gone there so often with his father back in the day. Advertising is only one of many professional interests Patrick has pursued, as he has also worked in publishing and audio engineering. Now his main line of work is with Old Navy as a manager in the production art department. But in talking to Patrick one gets a clear sense that his “day job” takes a back seat to his wide array of side gigs, such as music, his continuing love of the arts (he taught art and photography at his alma mater Campolindo), briefly taking up triathlons and completing the “Escape From Alcatraz” and activities like doing merchandise for the Youtube channel “Tennis Spin,” on which he now appears as a player. “The Trouble With Monkeys” also regularly plays gigs around the Bay Area (learn more at www.thetroublewithmonkeys.com) and when Peter Tork, an original member of “The Monkees”, passed away in 2019, the band was asked to play a tribute gig at “Mac’s at Nineteen Broadway” in Fairfax. So clearly Patrick is spinning many plates at any given time, and it’s a wonder that he has any time left for tennis.



Although he grew up playing both football and baseball, Patrick had never played any tennis until he was in his 40’s and started dating WCRC member Jules Lennon shortly before the Covid pandemic exploded and shut our society down. Jules joked that if they were going to date he would have to learn how to hit a tennis ball, so Patrick started by banging the ball against a wall for practice. As his skills developed, he spent much of the Covid shutdown era hitting with Jules, who lived in Sausalito at the time. With all that practice, once the pandemic abated and society reopened, Patrick got more serious about the game but found that there was a dearth of club opportunities in Sausalito. That changed dramatically when he moved back to his native East

Bay and settled at Heather Farm, which he says has a reputation as a high-level, competitive club even in Marin County. Patrick found that reputation to be well deserved and is a regular at Heather Farm now, which he enjoys not only for the high level of play and community spirit, but also because its large membership includes tremendous diversity, both ethnic and cultural diversity and diversity of background life experiences that enrich us all. Ironically, Patrick's first memory of Heather Farm is from when he was a child and knocked himself out by falling off the playground monkey bars there as he played while his father visited friends

nearby. His return as an adult did not include any playground accidents, but like so many club players, Patrick started his USTA career at Heather Farm as a member of one of Cara Mia Barnacascel's well-known "Deuces Wild" teams, and he has competed in USTA leagues and played regularly ever since.

If you ever get the chance to talk to WCRC member Patrick Wong you should jump at it because his eclectic background has provided him with many interesting tales to tell, and he relays them all with good humor. But you might have trouble tracking Patrick down, because like The Monkees themselves, he's too busy singing to put anybody down. ▲

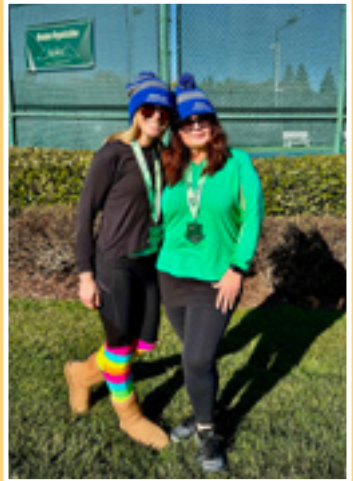
The WC Day 7.5A Team (captained by Stacey Blackman & Allene Rognon) competed at Broadstone for the NorCal Sectionals Title.

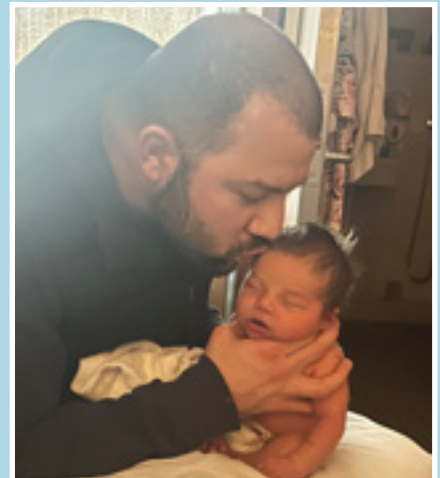


First time parents Rebecca and Eugene welcome a baby boy!

(players grouped by combined NTRP level; ie. 7.0 can be a 4.0 man and a 3.0 woman or two 3.5 players)

NTRP LEVELS Mixed 6.0–9.0*

SCHEDULING This is an open schedule. Players are responsible for scheduling their own matches. Players will be provided with a contact list of participants within their division.

MATCH FORMAT Best two-out-of-three set format.
A super tiebreaker can be played if all players agree, otherwise full third.
Both teams responsible for bringing balls to match; winning team gets the unopened can.
Matches should be played according to the "Rules of Tennis."

TOURNAMENT End of season tournament with draw determined by league standings to be held over the weekend of Mar 1–2, 2025 dependent upon court scheduling and weather. To qualify for the tournament, teams must have completed and reported at least 2 matches during the regular league season. Depending on the number of entrants tournament play may include Friday night play. In addition, draws with large numbers of players may be required to play matches prior to the tournament weekend. Seeding for the tournament will be based on regular season standings of the top 4 teams in each division. The more matches you and your partner play, the higher your ranking will be. A minimum of 4 teams are required to generate a draw.



* Teams with ratings more than 1 full step apart (i.e. 3.0 & 5.0 to make up an 8.0 team) are not eligible to play the end of season tournament.
