THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

"I know their game." Have you ever said those words before? Better yet, has anyone said this to you while discussing their opponent against whom they're about to play right before a match? What does that mean, really? "I know their game" implies that they have a strategy or game plan on how to play their opponent, but that's not always the case, apparently.

I was thinking about this when I was watching a USTA match recently. The doubles line I was watching was very competitive and had a lot of great points, and I knew all four players playing that line. What puzzled me, however, was that one of the players kept serving to his opponent's forehand. Now, the opponent on the return is known for having a terrific forehand that had a lot of topspin, pace, and control, but the backhand side isn't nearly as strong and would be the side you want to work on. I even use that strategy to keep playing his backhand myself with good success in a previous match against him. One of the server's teammates happen to be watching beside me:

Me: "Why does he keep serving to his forehand?"

Teammate: "I have no idea. He even said that he knows his game."

Me: "Doesn't look like it to me."

As we both watched the match, the returner kept blasting forehand returns back consistently, and I don't even think he even saw a serve going to his backhand side. The returner and his partner ended up winning in a very close supertie, but I can't help but think that the outcome would've been different if there was that one simple change in strategy.

So when a teammate tells you that "they know their game" right before they face their opponent, discuss with them what their game plan or strategy is, because "knowing their game" and actually doing something about it are two completely different things.

Nourishing Her Roots While Growing The Tennis Tree: Theresa Goodwin

W CRC member Theresa Goodwin established very deep roots while growing up in “The Town”, Oakland, and the activities of her adult life are a testament to her firm commitment to honoring and respecting those deep roots while growing the tennis tree throughout the greater East Bay and working to make the game of tennis more accessible to everyone regardless of their background or socioeconomic status.

Theresa was raised in East Oakland and her mother and grandmother actually still live in the same house they all shared during Theresa’s youth. Theresa’s first sporting love is basketball and she has always been an avid hoopster from a very young age, but she first got out on the tennis court during middle school when a coach who recognized her obvious athletic talent invited her to try out a new sport on a different court.

Theresa is also a proud alumnus of the Oakland Unified School District, (OUSD), having attended Elmhurst Middle School and Castlemont High School. All the while she was primarily focused on playing hoops (her position was point guard, running the offense) but Theresa continued playing tennis once she was introduced to the sport. However, Castlemont did not have a tennis team for her to join so she concentrated on basketball in high school, which segued directly into her college hoops career due to her skills on the hardwood.



After graduating from Castlemont Theresa played basketball for a few years at the junior college level in Kansas City before transferring into Hannibal College in Missouri, where she played for the Trojans at the NAIA Division 1 college level for four years.

After completing her collegiate career Theresa moved back to the East Bay Area to teach and coach basketball. She earned two masters degrees, one in education and the other in coaching athletic administration, and she’s put both advanced degrees to good use to improve the quality of educational and athletic offerings in OUSD. She’s taught physical education throughout the district during her thirteen year tenure with

OUSD, and for six years she coached the boys varsity basketball team at Oakland Charter High School outside of the district, because while Theresa has always loved playing basketball, her true passion is coaching. At Oakland Charter High Theresa also served as the athletic director before deciding to return to working within the OUSD because that's where she came from herself. In an additional effort to improve the lives of the students in OUSD, four years ago Theresa started a business to create after school enrichment programs for OUSD schools, which are designed to provide an infrastructure for students to remain active after school in a structured, constructive way. Theresa's enrichment programs are heavily focused on tennis, and are offered at various schools throughout the district.

When her body couldn't accept the stress of hoops anymore Theresa increasingly began playing more tennis throughout the East Bay, including on teams at Mills College in Oakland, Bay



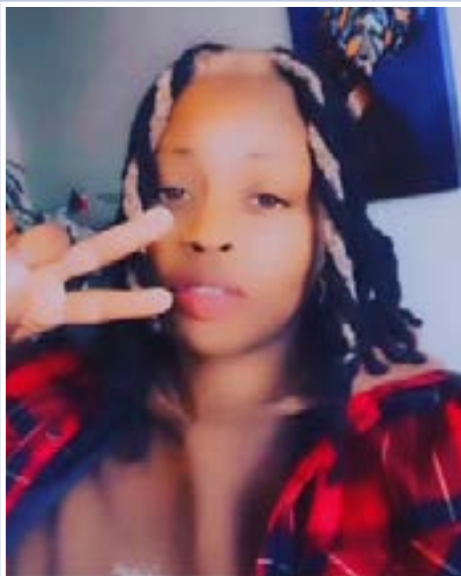
Trees Park in Castro Valley, and at Pleasant Hill Middle School, which is where she met Tammie Snyder, who invited Theresa out to hit at Heather Farm. Like everyone who enters the WCRC community, Theresa has been warmly welcomed at the club, and although it's a long commute from her home in Oakland, she finds the atmosphere at Heather Farm both motivating and joyful, where the courts are always full and the atmosphere so positive and inclusive.

Because Theresa has played in so many different areas of the East Bay, two years ago she decided to start a club to grow the sport and unite the many fascinating people she's met, especially among underrepresented populations. "The Town Tennis Club" that she founded is an Oakland-based tennis community that has quickly grown to over 600 members. It's a free club, by referral, which utilizes all of the public courts in

Oakland and is designed to make the game of tennis more inclusive and less costly, so that more people are able to enjoy the game of tennis "with people who look like them", according to Theresa. Along with a professional career in which she continuously strove to improve the quality of life for the students in her hometown, through "The Town Tennis Club" Theresa has been able to broaden her impact throughout the entire community.

Theresa still lives in Oakland with her labradoodle Romeo, who is her frequent companion on her long walks.

If you see WCRC member Theresa Goodwin rolling up to the club, you might notice that her personalized license plate reads "Tee Good". That's not merely a play on her name, it also serves

as her constant reminder to herself to “be good”. It’s a reminder Theresa has heeded throughout a lifetime as an educator and entrepreneur who has worked passionately to make the beautiful game of tennis accessible to everyone regardless of their background, and in her case, actions truly speak much louder than words. ▲
