In the Men's 3.5 Chase had a tough day, defeating Soliman 5-7, 6-3, 7-5 and then going on



seed Slover 6-4, 6-2 and then really got the crowd going, taking Hidayat to three sets in the finals. Ron pulled it out, defeating Judson 6-4, 4-6, 6-3.





The Women's 2.5 division is in its third year and they had 8 players in the tournament. Moncton won easily over Sianghio in her semi-final 6-1, 6-0 while Ann Miller had to battle against

Van Oosbree, but she pulled it out, 4-6, 6-4, 6-3. Ann went on to win the final 6-2. 6-1.

In the Women's 3.0 had one player, Sellinger get defaults all the way into the Semi-finals, where she lost to Robinson 6-1, 6-4. In the other semi Britton defeated Brugmann 4-6, 7-5, 6-2. Robinson then went on to win over Britton 6-4, 6-4.


