

Let there be light

Members of the Walnut Creek Racquet Club are feeling very pleased with themselves these days. After four years of perseverance, the club finally succeeded in getting new lighting installed on the 10 courts at Heather Farm Park.

"We've now got one of the best facilities around for nighttime tennis," boasted Al Forester, a past president of the 500-member racquet club.

As chairman of the lighting committee, Forester was instrumental in seeing the project through to fruition.

"He really took the bull by the horns," said the club's current president, Chris Ramsower. "He really stuck with it."

Anyone who's driven past

Heather Farm Park lately at night probably noticed the new illumination—contractors completed the \$86,000 project just last week. Three of the 10 courts, which were previously unlit, received modern new lighting systems, and the lighting on seven other courts was upgraded.

All in all, things are looking pretty bright.

It all started when club members began talking about asking the city to replace some lights on a few of the courts. They were unsuccessful in that attempt, but the seed was sown. After several false starts and a few delays, they eventually persuaded the city to match funding for the project.

Forester said they were able to

increase in the club's annual dues. The club and the city each committed to \$43,000, with the club repaying the balance of their portion in annual payments.

"It took so long to get this project done, but in a way it was a blessing," said Forester, "because we ended up being able raise money and get a lot more done then we originally planned."

The Walnut Creek Racquet Club is actually older then the courts the members play on, said Forester. The club was formed a year before Heather Farm Park and the courts were built. At that time, the only city-owned tennis courts were the two courts across the street from Walnut Creek City Hall.

"We actually have quite a few charter members still with the club," Forester said.

Although players weren't

exactly having trouble seeing the net or hitting each other in the head with the ball, Forester said things were getting pretty dim out there on the courts.

"A lot of us members are getting older and our eyes are getting bad," he kidded. "The lighting was definitely inadequate."

"What was strange is some of the poles didn't even have lights on them," said Jim Farber, director of tennis for the city.

He said members are now raving about the improved visibility on the courts.

"It's a tremendous improvement," Farber said. "It's taken all the dark pots off the courts.

"One of the best things of all though is that we have three more courts we can play on at night. That's really helpful in the winter time, especially when it gets dark so early."
