

Chessa Mehlman's Dedication to Special Olympics by Pam Maloney



On Saturday, June 27th, Orindawoods Tennis Club will host the seventh annual **Ace It!**, a full day of tennis-related activities to raise money in support of the Carol Ann Read Breast Health Center at Alta Bates Summit Medical Center in Oakland. Over the past seven years, the local tennis community has raised almost one hundred thousand dollars for breast cancer at this annual event, which features tennis clinics by local pros in the morning, a gourmet lunch and raffle, and a tournament in the afternoon. Attendees can choose to come for the entire day, morning or afternoon (lunch included) or just lunch.

Seven years ago the Carol Ann Read Breast Health Center did not exist. A group of women tennis players in Contra Costa County became aware that many of their friends and acquaintances had experienced tremendous anxiety and inconvenience

when faced with a possible diagnosis or course of treatment for breast cancer, not just because of the diagnosis but also because there was no local, centralized place in the East Bay for these services. Diagnosis could take weeks and treatment often required travel to San Francisco or the peninsula and could even mean quitting a job to accommodate appointment schedules.

Originally, **Ace It!** was intended to raise money for charities benefiting breast cancer patients. However, as soon as the **Ace It!** organizing group became aware of the Carol Ann Read Center plans, fundraising focused on the local facility, which opened two years ago and was named one of the top ten such facilities in the nation in 2008. Last November **Ace**



It! was the honoree sponsored by Alta Bates Summit Foundation at the National Philanthropy Day award luncheon. Other sponsors at this prestigious event were Children's Hospital, AAA, Charles Schwab, United Way, Glide Foundation, KQED, and the YMCA.

From the Pro....

Questions and Answers

QUESTION: I have improved many parts of my game over the years and currently play at a 4.0 level. The hardest thing still for me, and what is holding me back from a 4.5, is the pressure during a point. What is the best way to deal with pressure during play? I feel like I hit like Federer during warm-up (hahaha), but when play is on with a rival, I tend to tighten up, choke and play more apprehensive.



I hate that! What's the best way to avoid this? Would love to know what the pros do.

ANSWER: Often a player will feel like a Roger Federer or a Justine Henin during warm-up. Remember that your opponents are intentionally hitting balls to you. They'll even feed you lobs and overheads if you asked them. Match play is much more competitive. Opponents will make you run, throw various spins and play the least predictable game as possible. A stan-dard procedure for my teams is to play a minimum of four games (one serve each for doubles) prior to match time. This is more of a complete warm-up. If you have no one to play prior to your opponent, try this simple drill... Run around your backhands to hit forehands and vice versa. I do this on volleys, too. This will get your legs and body warm in no time. It's not bad for focusing on the ball, too.
